Brigadier General Allan E. Day is the Commander of Defense Logistics Agency Aviation, a field activity of the Defense Logistics Agency. With its headquarters in Richmond, Virginia, and operating at 18 sites across the U.S., DLA Aviation is the aviation demand and supply chain manager for DLA with more than 3,500 civilian and military personnel. DLA Aviation supports more than 1,340 weapon systems, with focused support to 130 major weapon systems, and is the U.S. military's integrated materiel manager for more than 1.2 million national stock number items, industrial retail supply and depot-level repairable acquisitions. Brigadier General Day oversees an aviation demand chain responsible for more than \$4.2 billion in annual sales.

Positioned alongside its military customers, DLA Aviation manages industrial support activities at Robins Air Force Base, Georgia; Tinker AFB, Oklahoma; Hill AFB, Utah; Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, North Carolina; Naval Air Station North Island, California and NAS Jacksonville, Florida.

DLA Aviation manages depot-level repairable procurement operations at Robins, Tinker and Hill Air Force Bases; Naval Supply Systems Command (NAVSUP) Weapon Systems Support, Philadelphia; and at Redstone Army Arsenal, Alabama. DLA Aviation also operates an industrial plant equipment maintenance, repair and overhaul facility at Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania.

Brigadier General Day was commissioned in 1989 from the United States Air Force Academy, Colorado Springs, Colorado, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in chemistry.

Brigadier General Day previously served as Associate Director of Resource Integration, Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics, Installations and Mission Support, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C., where he was responsible for the planning, programming and budgeting of weapons systems sustainment, equipment, and logistics and installations resource requirements. As part of the Air DLA AVIATION



Force corporate structure, he monitored performance of operations and maintenance, working capital funds and investment programs; participated in program and financial review groups; and advocated for financial adjustments to optimize force readiness. He also oversaw preparation and defense of these Air Force programs to the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Office of Management and Budget, and Congress.

He has held key maintenance leadership positions at the wing, major command, and air staff levels.


A published materials engineer and logistician, he holds a master aircraft maintenance and a senior acquisition badge along with a basic parachute rating and is Level III certified in program management.
