



Col. Corey New

United States Army Col. Corey New is a native of Rumford, Maine. He graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1991 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mathematics. In 2011, New received his dual Master's degree in Business Administration and Global Supply Chain Management through Indiana University at Bloomington and Certificate in Global Supply Chain Leadership from University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He recently graduated from the Naval War College where he received a Master's Degree in National Security and Strategic Studies.

Upon commissioning, he attended the Infantry Officer Basic Course at Fort Benning, Ga., and was later transferred into the Transportation Corps in 1993. He is a graduate of the Combined Logistics Officer Advance Course at Fort Lee, Va., and Army Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan.

His initial assignments include platoon leader and company executive officer for the 73rd Transportation Company at Fort Eustis, Va., from October 1992 to August 1994. While stationed at Fort Eustis, he deployed in support of Operation Uphold Democracy in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, from September 1994 to February 1995 serving as a port operations officer. Upon returning, he then served as the battalion adjutant for the 10th Transportation Battalion from September 1995 to November 1996.

Upon graduating from the Combined Logistics Officer Advance Course, he stationed in Germany where his first assignment was as the transportation plans officer, Support Operations for 3rd COSCOM in Wiesbaden, Germany, from July 1996 to July 1997. In August 1997, he became the S3 plans officer, 27th Transportation Battalion in Wiesbaden, Germany. In March 1998, he deployed to Bosnia in support of Operation Joint Guard for five months. In July 1998, he was selected to command the 377th Transportation Company (HET) in Grafenwoehr, Germany. He commanded for over 22 months during which he deployed the company to Thessaloniki, Greece, where they provide heavy transportation support to Camp Able Sentry in Macedonia. Following his company command, his next assignment was in Alexandria, Va., where he served as the lieutenants and captains assignment officer for the Transportation Branch of Human Resources Command from May 2000 to July 2002.

Following graduation from the Command and General Staff College, he served as the division transportation officer for the 10th Mountain Division (LI) at Fort Drum, N.Y., from July 2003 to August 2004. During this assignment, he deployed for 11 months in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom in Bagram, Afghanistan. Upon redeploying, he was assigned as the Battalion S3, 10th Brigade Support Battalion, 1st Brigade Combat Team from August 2004 to May 2005. In June 2005, he became the battalion executive officer for the 10th Brigade Support Battalion. In July, he deployed with the Battalion to Baghdad, Iraq, in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom for 12 months. Upon returning in July 2006, he was reassigned as the CENTCOM Joint Operation Planning and Execution System action officer in the J3/4, Joint Forces Command in Norfolk, Va. He commanded the 53rd Transportation Battalion (Movement Control) where he deployed the Battalion headquarters to Joint Base Balad, Iraq, in January 2011 in support of Operation New Dawn.

Personal awards and decorations include the Bronze Star with two oak leaf clusters, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster, Army Achievement Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Award, and Army Superior Unit Award. He has the Air Assault and Airborne Badge and various campaign and service ribbons.
