Army Lt. Col. Jeffrey P. Chamberlain was born in Fort Sill, Oklahoma and grew up in southern California. He enlisted into the U.S. Army in 1990 as an administrative specialist, deployed in support of Desert Shield/Desert Storm to Fort Ord Army Hospital, California, and rose to the rank of sergeant.

He graduated from the University of San Diego with a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations and a Paralegal Certificate, and was commissioned in the U.S. Army Field Artillery as a 2nd lieutenant from the San Diego State University ROTC. He also holds a Master of Business Administration degree from Baylor University.

Chamberlain has served in the U.S. Army Reserve, California Army National Guard and the Regular Army, with nine years civilian leadership experience in corporate sales management.
