



## **Lt. Col. Mark D. Wolf, United States Army Commander, DLA Distribution Korea**

United States Army Lt. Col. Mark D. Wolf assumed command of DLA Distribution Korea on July 10, 2014.

Wolf enlisted in the Army in 1991 as an infantryman (11B) and served in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 75<sup>th</sup> Ranger Regiment, where he achieved the rank of sergeant.

He graduated from Officer Candidate School as a Distinguished Military Graduate and was commissioned into the Transportation Corps in 1995. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations from the University of California, Davis, and a master's degree in General Administration from Central Michigan University. Wolf's military education includes the Transportation Basic and Advance Courses, Combined Arms Services and Staff School, Army Command and General Staff College, and the Advanced Military Transition Team Course.

Wolf's previous assignments include platoon leader, 1098<sup>th</sup> Transportation Company (Medium Boat) and executive officer, 329<sup>th</sup> Transportation Company (Heavy Boat), Fort Eustis, Va. He served as the operations officer and headquarters detachment commander, 71<sup>st</sup> Transportation Battalion and as a training, assessment and counseling officer for the Transportation Officer Basic Course.

Wolf subsequently served as the S1, 28<sup>th</sup> Transportation Battalion and commander, 69<sup>th</sup> Transportation Company (Medium Truck), Mannheim, Germany. Upon completing company command, he served as the operations officer for the Commanding General, U.S. Army Europe. Following CGSC, Wolf served as the chief of Military Transition Team 2302, which trained the 34<sup>th</sup> Iraqi Armored Brigade's Logistics Battalion. He also served as the support operations officer, 10<sup>th</sup> Support Group and executive officer, 505<sup>th</sup> Quartermaster Battalion, Okinawa, Japan. In his most recent assignment, Wolf served as the mobility chief for the 19<sup>th</sup> Expeditionary Sustainment Command in Daegu, Korea.

Wolf has earned the Ranger Tab, Expert Infantry Badge and Parachute Badge. His decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Achievement Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Overseas Service Ribbon.
