Thank you, team, for the impact you've made on me, my career and my respect for all you do every day to support our warfighters!



Acquisition Workforce Symposium

From June 13-15, DLA Energy acquisition employees chose from a variety of learning opportunities and experiences designed to inform, inspire, and empower their personal and professional development.

During his opening remarks, Deputy Commander Dave Kless encouraged employees to take full advantage of the symposium reminding them that one person can mean the difference between mission success or mission failure.

In an analogy, Kless talked about how the Buffalo Bills' assistant athletic trainer, Denny



"Denny didn't show up on game day to watch football. He practiced. He prepared. He continued to stay sharp. He stayed alert, aware of his surroundings, never complacent or distracted," Kless said. "Denny didn't wait for anyone else to respond. He took immediate action. His instinct and training kicked in. He didn't need to wait. He knew what to do."

"Even if you are an 'assistant' or in a position you feel inconsequential, your role is vital to the team's success," Kless said. "We depend on you to stay alert, take notice if something seems 'off,' and take action."



Following Kless was a series of guest speakers including DLA Acquisition Director Matt Beebe, former DLA Energy commander retired Lt Gen Giovanni Tuck and retired Maj Gen Eugene Lupia.

Day two of the symposium included a discussion on

the future of acquisition training from Defense Acquisition University President James Woolsey and a full day focused on career development in the functional areas of contracting, lifecycle logistics and engineering and technical management. Eileen Granfield, DAU 4th Estate DACM Team Deputy Director, talked LCL strategic development and Eidila Correa, DLA Logistics Operations Technical & Quality Assurance Division Chief, talked to the ETM community.

Day three brought discussions on the future of work, work-life balance, emotional intelligence, and leading in a hybrid environment.

During his final All Hands on June 21, Brig Gen Canlas congratulated the DLA Energy military and civilian employees of the quarter, welcomed several incoming leaders, bid farewell to those departing and shared important news and updates with workforce.

Nearly 200 employees attended in person with more than 370 joining online.

This week, Brig Gen Canlas changes command with CAPT Brian Anderson and retires from the Air Force. He told the audience he plans to take 90 days off to spend time with his family and help his kids off to college.
