RPPOB: REPLENISHMENT PARTS PURCHASE OR BORROW

DoD Manual <u>4140.01 (PDF)</u> Volume 9 allows contractors to buy or borrow partnumbered items to reverse engineer at their own expense. Contractors interested in the Reverse Engineering Program can submit their <u>Reverse Engineering Re-</u> quest and we will get back to you in a timely manner.

The contractor will physically examine the item; produce drawings and specifications through technical analysis performed during the reverse engineering process, and provide same for review. The contractor and the Government agree when the borrowed part will be returned or a Source Approval Request (SAR) package will be provided to the Government.

Domestic business concerns may purchase, borrow, or view replenishment parts for the following purposes:

- Design replication, product improvement or modification, and alternate sourcing through product identification or reverse engineering practices;
- Development of data packages required to obtain approval to sell like parts to the Government; and,
- Enhance competition with resultant cost reduction by obtaining alternative sources of supply and manufacturing.

CONTRACTOR RETENTION OF SUPPLY CHAIN TRACEABILITY

DLA recently revised *Procurement Note CO3, Contractor Retention of Supply Chain Traceability;* the note is included in all solicitations and awards in accordance with DLAD 4.703.

Summary of changes:

paragraph (1)	paragraph (2)	paragraph (3)
"Contractor" no longer excludes manu- facturer	Added requirement for traceability to include the drawing or specification	Traceability is now required to be provided within three business days
Clarifies that traceability needs to show that the item conforms to technical requirements OR, when it is a part numbered item, is from an approved manufacturer	Traceability is now required to include manufacturer's batch identification for item(s), when available (changed from "should" to "shall")	Traceability must be re- tained for ten years (previously six)
	Moved and expanded on requirement for documentation of inspections and tests

CO3 Contractor Retention of Supply Chain Traceability Documentation (JUN 2020)

- (1) By submitting a quotation or offer, the contractor is confirming it currently has, or will obtain before delivery, and shall retain supply chain traceability documentation, as described in paragraph (2) of this procurement note, demonstrating the item conforms to the technical requirements, and, for part numbered items, is from an approved manufacturer.
- (2) Supply Chain Traceability Documentation
 - (i) Supply chain traceability documentation shall include: basic item description; part number; drawing or specification; national stock number; manufacturing source; manufacturing source's Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) code; and clear identification of the name and location of all supply chain intermediaries between the manufacturer to the contractor to Government acceptance.
 - (ii) Supply chain traceability documentation shall also include, when available, the manufacturer's batch identification for the item(s), such as date codes, lot codes, or serial numbers. For part numbered items, contractors can find examples of acceptable supply chain traceability documentation at the Counterfeit Detection and Avoidance Program (CDAP) website:



CONTRACTOR RETENTION OF SUPPLY CHAIN TRACEABILITY (CONT.)

(2) Supply Chain Traceability Documentation

(iii) In addition, the contractor will obtain, retain, and provide to the contracting officer written documentation of all inspections and tests necessary to substantiate that the supplies furnished under this contract conform to contract requirements, including any applicable technical requirements for specified manufacturers' parts. Such records shall include, without limitation, test reports, test data, material certification, and manufacturing process sheets, in addition to any other information identified in the technical specifications applicable to the item.

(3) The contractor shall make supply chain traceability documentation available to the contracting officer within three business days upon the contracting officer's request. The contracting officer determines the acceptability and sufficiency of documentation. The contractor shall retain supply chain traceability documentation for ten years after final payment under this contract for audit and other valid government purposes. If the contractor fails to retain or provide the documentation, or the contracting officer finds the documentation to be unacceptable, the contracting officer may take corrective action, including, but not limited to, cancellation of undelivered orders or rejection of delivered supplies.
