






Combat Uniform Sales FY2020 – FY2022






Obligations FY2020 - FY2022

NexGen Uniforms

USMC Uniform Status:

<u>Currently issuing 3 types of uniforms</u>
under 3 supply vehicles

As an enterprise: *increase utility and decrease logistics*

MCCUU – For all Marines wear in garrison, general training, & some deployment. DLA TS sustained.

→ NexGen MCCUU:

End state- increase durability, increase breathability, increase function in tropical environment, increase signature management. Ideal objective- add FR to increase protection and readiness

Flame Resistant Combat Ensemble
(FRCE) / Enhanced Flame-Resistant
Combat Ensemble (EFRCE) – For
deployment when flame hazard probable
to reduce burn injuries. MCSC procured
and CSP managed.
No current contracts.

→ Close Combat Uniform: industry shows capabilities to increase breathability and moisture comfort. Enduring need.

Need for combat shirt Need for kneepads Need for MWIR and LWIR protection (separate or in uniform)

<u>MCTCU</u> – For deployment to tropics for faster-drying & improved comfort. MCSC procured and CSP/Albany managed.

MCTCU → Requirements in place & sustained

NexGen MCCUU Capabilities

Use the RFP to solidify the ways of improvement to the existing uniform capabilities; reducing burden and decreasing logistics for the enterprise while providing improved capabilities to Marines.

Conduct user evaluation to gain qualitative insights on trade space, art of the possible, Marine acceptability and needs in FY23/24. Finalize trade space and requirements FY24/25.

NexGen MCCUU Timeline

COMPLETED:

- ➤ RFI released Nov 2020 → need for defined tradeoffs
- USMC developed a CCU IPT to address Marine's needs & wants of future uniform
- Internal trade space examination & taskers on capability needs (quantitative)

NEXT STEPS:

- ➤ Potential <u>industry day</u>: week of Dec 12th (tentative)
- ▶ RFP→ 1) Art of the possible & 2) Verify needs and understand acceptability to Marines (qualitative)
 - > RFP release: February March
- RFP closes: March
- > Source Selection: April
- Uniform delivery: (small quantities, estimated no more than 200) June/July
- ➤ <u>LUEs</u>: with RFP buys- July-September
 - Programmatic decision on requirements
 - Additional development/LUE procurement FY24
 - Begin sustainment FY25
