# ANTHONY D'AMBROSIO

**Anthony D'Ambrosio** is being inducted into the Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support Hall of Fame, Class of 2022 for his outstanding mission support from 1985 to 2018. Throughout his federal career of 33 years, Mr. D'Ambrosio was a respected leader and role model amongst his staff and peers.

Mr. D'Ambrosio began his federal career as a Procurement Agent, excelling at a series of positions within DLA Troop Support and its legacy organizations, culminating his career as the Deputy Director of the Construction & Equipment supply chain. Throughout his ten-year tenure in this role, Mr. D'Ambrosio provided oversight of acquisition and logistics programs that produced more than \$29 billion in sales, and he was instrumental in the expansion of key tailored vendor logistics support programs including Special Operational Equipment, Maintenance Repair and Operations, and Fire and Emergency Service Equipment. He was also instrumental in providing support for critical humanitarian assistance mission assignments such as the Ebola outbreak in Liberia and Hurricanes Harvey and Maria.

Throughout his career, Mr. D'Ambrosio excelled as a leader in the acquisition process. He embraced continuous process improvement, constantly looking at ways to improve processes and reducing acquisition cycle time to reduce costs and increase effectiveness across the Construction & Equipment supply chain.

Mr. D'Ambrosio demonstrated superior leadership in every position occupied. His unparalleled levels of professionalism and leadership earned him many times over, the respect and admiration of everyone who had the joy of knowing and working with him. Whether it was guidance to navigate a personnel issue, understanding of complex acquisition regulations, the right touch on a strategic communication, or a simple conversation, he was always available. Mr. D'Ambrosio was a consummate professional, who left an indelible impact on DLA Troop Support and its warfighter support mission.
