is being inducted posthumously into the Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support Hall of Fame this fifth day of November for his outstanding mission support from 1973 through 2005. Mr. Maunz spent his entire 32-year DLA career in the Medical supply chain. His ground-breaking accomplishments are a testament to the hard work and dedication demonstrated during his distinguished years of service to the warfighter. He succeeded in developing and implementing innovative business practices, including advanced automated budget-related programs and procedures. Medical's transition from a resource-intensive, manual operation to an automated, Enterprise Business System-supported business highlighted his innovations and the exceptional drive characteristic of his career with the agency. Mr. Maunz led the DLA development of the Army Single Stock Fund, now called the Army Medical Material Agreement. This program permits the Army to order consumable medical materiel in the absence of an Army stock fund and continues to ensure worldwide readiness while highlighting DLA's commitment to Army warfighter support at the most critical medical treatment facility locations. Mr. Maunz was also instrumental in the enterprise design of the Business Systems Modernization organizational structure currently used throughout the agency. His vast knowledge and experience, and the way he shared that knowledge and experience, will live on in the hearts and minds of the personnel, customers, commercial industry partners, and the entire Medical logistics community. His contributions, gifts to the logistics community, and his legacy will live on forever in the supply chain and in the entire medical logistics community.
