

Hall of Fame Inductees

Jack Boyle

Jack Boyle was inducted into the Defense Supply Center Philadelphia Hall of Fame this twenty ninth day of October 2008 for his continuous outstanding mission support throughout his 27-year tenure at DSCP. With a thorough knowledge of the subject matter and a penchant for hard work, Mr. Boyle rapidly rose up through the ranks to the Comptroller position. He managed the financial operations of four DLA Supply Chains at DSCP, the largest of the Defense Logistics Agency's Inventory Control Points. His financial acumen guided these commodities from sales of a few billion dollars to over 10 billion dollars of business. He served as the single individual responsible for the finance for multiple supply chains and displayed exceptional stewardship in driving these business entities to sales levels unseen in DLA. He presided over the DLA's move to Defense Working Capital Fund and Business Systems Modernization, melding financial concepts with a new emerging financial system. Prior to retirement, Mr. Boyle served as the Deputy Director, Business Systems Modernization Office. He played a key role in the establishment of the BSM Office, building the Senior Sponsors Group and overseeing the BSM Concept Demonstration in Subsistence. A senior DLA manager once referred to Jack Boyle as the "finest financial mind in DLA", a testament that those who worked with him and for him knew to be true.
