

Paul Zebrowski

Paul Zebrowski is being inducted into the Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support Hall of Fame this twentieth day of November 2014 for his outstanding mission support from 1977 through 2011. Mr. Zebrowski was a brilliant logistician who held a variety of leadership positions at DLA Troop Support and DLA Headquarters, but is best known for his many contributions to the Clothing and Textiles supply chain. He was a consummate manager who believed in training and mentoring his team in a way that ensured their success. He regularly provided his workforce with educational opportunities; offered personalized training across all levels and institutionalized professional problem-solving methods that became so effective many of them remain today. Mr. Zebrowski assumed the position of C&T's Deputy Director at a particularly tumultuous time in the supply chain that left the workforce extremely vulnerable. Mr. Zebrowski's confident, methodical approach to returning normalcy to the workplace allowed employees to recover and continue to provide their signature world-class support. Mr. Zebrowski's work with the Industrial Base was equally effective. He established beneficial, productive relationships with industry groups that remain in place today. He understood that nurturing the Industrial Base was essential to C&T's viability and he remained steadfast to strengthen it. He received a multitude of performance awards throughout each year of his government career. He concluded his career as the DLA Chief of Acquisition Operations.
