



Hall of Fame Inductees

Major General Raymond V. Mason

Major General Raymond V. Mason was inducted into the Defense Supply Center Philadelphia Hall of Fame this twenty ninth day of October 2008 for his extraordinary leadership as DSCP's Commander from 2003 through 2005. General Mason was responsible for the end-to-end supply chain, leadership, direction and worldwide operational procurement of subsistence, clothing and textiles, medical materiel and construction and equipment requirements. These items were in support of the U.S. Armed Forces, DoD activities and other Federal Agencies. Under his leadership, DSCP achieved unprecedented levels of performance in every measurable category. DSCP increased FY 04 sales from \$10B to \$12B, while reducing the Cost Recovery Plan to an all-time low. He developed process changes to handle all surge demands and directed the establishment of several long-term, high-value contracts for high-priority/high-demand items. Additionally, DSCP increased the body armor production base to meet monthly combat requirements and awarded immediate contracts that provided 42 thousand sheets of hardened steel for increased armor protection to the forces in Iraq. His personal involvement and commitment to supporting national priorities, both at home and abroad, was evidenced by his efforts to outfit the Iraqi National Guard with Extreme Cold Weather Clothing System parkas and trousers. He also ensured 3.2 million Nerve Agent Antidote Auto Injectors were provided to protect warfighters. He accomplished all of this while leading the Agency through implementation of the largest Business Systems Modernization transformation within DoD.
