BRIGADIER GENERAL WILLIAM A. MCCAIN U.S. ARMY (RET)

Is posthumously inducted into the Defense Personnel Support Center (DPSC) Hall of Fame this twelfth day of August 1994 for his extraordinary leadership and support as Commanding Officer of the Philadelphia Quartermaster Depot from 1934 to 1941. General McCain supervised the facility's biggest peacetime job of fully outfitting the 600,000-man Civilian Conservation Corps with clothing and textile materials. This overwhelming task helped provide invaluable assistance to millions during the Great Depression and prepared the Quartermaster Depot for the massive buildup of World War II. He also oversaw the construction of a new clothing factory and other buildings which proved essential during the war.
