- B. For all items in which split cases can be accommodated, Muir Copper Canyon Farms will not up-charge the units on broken case lots.
- C. Muir Copper Canyon Farms will not invoke any additional charges for emergency orders (defined as an order that is placed for same day delivery).
- D. The USDA School and Reservation Customers are required to place orders no later than 72 hours before delivery date.

**VIII. PACKAGING AND MARKING**

- A. All packaging and packing shall be in accordance with good commercial practice. Labeling shall be in accordance with commercial labeling complying with Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act and regulations promulgated there under. Shipping containers shall be in compliance with the national Motor Freight Classification and Uniform Freight classification.
