

Subject: ALFOODACT 010-2011 Update to ALFOODACT 004-2011 Suspension Removal for Food Procurement from Specified Regions and Prefectures of Japan

Date Issued: August 7, 2011

2. BACKGROUND:

ALFOODACT 004-2011 placed a ban on procurement from specified regions and prefectures of Japan.

ALFOODACT 010-2011 provides notification to DoD procurement agencies of the launching of a web page hosted by DLA-Troop Support listing approved facilities within the previously established Japan Suspension Zone.

3. DISTRIBUTION:

This ALFOODACT and the associated webpage apply specifically to procurement of subsistence items grown in or produced in the designated regions and prefectures in Japan. Products imported into the U.S. or the European Union have been cleared by the appropriate regulatory agency and are exempt.

4. REASON FOR ACTION:

Establishment of The Approved Sources Within Japan Suspension Zone webpage and posting of an approved source for fresh apples. .

5. INSTRUCTIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR MESSAGE RECIPIENTS:

DLA -Troop Support launched a webpage listing establishments in the Japan Suspension Zone that have successfully completed enhanced testing, verification, and validation of food production facilities. The Approved Sources Within Japan Suspension Zone webpage URL is: <http://www.troopsupport.dla.mil/subs/fso/alfood/japanlist.asp> .

The webpage is a dynamic document and will be updated when facilities are validated and approved for DoD procurement. Procurement agencies/contracting officers should refer to the webpage frequently to view

current data. No further announcements of facility listings or delisting will be issued via the ALFOODACT system.
