MEMORANDUM FOR THE DLA CORPORATE BOARD

SUBJECT: Federal Worker 2000 Presidential Initiative

President Clinton issued a memorandum on July 2, 1999, establishing the subject initiative. The initiative directs all Federal agencies to reduce the occurrence of occupational injuries and provide more efficient care to injured personnel. Attached is a copy of the President's memorandum and other relevant correspondence.

The Federal Worker 2000 Presidential Initiative has provided an opportunity for DLA and DoD to achieve their long-term goals of reducing occupational injuries and illnesses to zero incidents. In support of the President's program, DLA activities will meet the following initiative goals:

- a. Reduce the overall occurrence of injuries by 3 percent per year, while improving the timeliness of reporting injuries and illnesses to the Department of Labor by 5 percent per year.
- b. For those selected work sites with the highest rates of serious injuries, reduce the occurrence of injuries by 10 percent per year.
- c. Reduce the rate of lost production days (i.e., the number of days employees spend away from work) by 2 percent per year.

Injury reduction goals for individual field activities are being developed and will be forwarded to you separately. You will also be provided recommended strategies and initiatives for achieving our long-term safety objectives. Your personal involvement and support are necessary to properly accomplish and implement the initiative.

I am committed to ensuring full and successful implementation of the President's Federal Worker 2000 initiative. I also look forward to discussing your performance and achievements in this initiative during my visits to the field.
