MEMORANDUM FOR PROCLTR DISTRIBUTION LIST

SUBJECT: Class Deviation from Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement
(DFARS) Part 204.202

DFARS [204.202\(1\)\(ii\)](#) requires agencies to distribute one copy of each contract to each consignee indicated in the contract. DFARS [204,202\(1\)\(ii\)\(A\)](#) modifies this requirement to allow inventory control points that have an automated uniform inventory control point data base that **interfaces with consignees to use their automated procedure rather than sending a written copy** of the contract. However, when inspection is required at destination, a written copy is required.

The Standard Automated Materiel Management System (SAMMS) interfaces with the Defense Distribution Depots' information systems to provide data on awarded contracts. The data input into the SAMMS Contract Technical Data File is sufficient to allow depot personnel to perform inspection. Accordingly, the Defense Distribution Depots do not need written copies of these contracts. Therefore, pursuant to the class deviation authority granted by the Director, Defense Procurement, to me by memorandum dated September 30, 1999, I authorize DLA activities to discontinue providing written copies of contracts, which are awarded in SAMMS and require destination acceptance, to the Defense Distribution Depots. This deviation does not apply to contracts requiring destination acceptance by consignees other than the Defense Distribution Depots.

This deviation is effective immediately and will remain in effect for 3 years. Our point of contact for this action is Mr. Gregory Ellsworth, DLSC-POA, DSN 427-1369.
