SUBJECT: Defense Automatic Addressing System Center (DAASC) Requests
For Logistics Transaction Services

DAASC, is a DoD enterprise-wide resource assigned to the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) eBusiness Office and is responsible for processing almost three billion logistics transactions per year for DoD and the civil sector. It provides supply chain information to the Military Services, DLA, United States Transportation Command (USTRANSCOM), and the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD). In addition, it provides routing and catastrophic recovery capabilities for the logistics community.

Quite naturally, because of its unique capabilities, DAASC is routinely inundated with special requests for logistics data and information. It does not have the resources to meet all demands placed upon it. Requests for DAASC information or services should be forwarded to the eBusiness Office of DLA. The eBusiness Office is the "clearing house" for requests for information or proposed changes in operations and works with DAASC, the Military Services, DLA, and OSD in responding to requests and establishing priorities. The eBusiness Office will respond to all requests within one month.

Requests that involve change or clarification of OSD policy should be forwarded through the eBusiness Office to the Director, Logistics Systems Modernization, Office of the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Logistics [DUSD (L)/LSM]. The LSM Director will be responsible for staffing the request.

Your cooperation is needed in following this established process to ensure that DAASC can continue to fulfill its critical mission while still being responsive to appropriate special requests.
