# 4. REQUESTED CHANGE(S):

- **a.** <u>Brief Overview of Change</u>: The U.S. Pacific Command (PACOM) changed its name to U.S. Indo-Pacific Command (USINDOPACOM). DoDAAD needs to change COCOM field length and value to align with new name assigned by DOD.
- **b.** <u>Background</u>: On May 30, 2018 there was a change of command ceremony on Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam to welcome a new commander, ADM Phil Davidson, who relieved ADM Harry Harris. Presiding over the ceremony, U.S. Defense Secretary James N. Mattis announced that USPACOM was also changing its name to U.S. Indo-Pacific Command (USINDOPACOM). "In recognition of the increasing connectivity between the Indian and

Pacific Oceans, today we rename the U.S. Pacific Command to U.S. Indo-Pacific Command," said Mattis. "Over many decades this command has repeatedly adapted to changing circumstances and today carries that legacy forward as America focuses west."

- c. Requested Change in Detail: The field length of the COCOM field is currently only ten characters and will not support the official DOD name without truncating the value. DAAS will need to change the field length in the DoDAAD table from ten characters to fifteen characters. After the field size is changed, all values of USPACOM in the DoDAAD table must be changed to USINDOPACOM. NOTE: USTRANSCOM Reference Data Management (TRDM) has not made the COCOM value change to the source table as of this request, so DAAS may have to hard-code USINDOPACOM into the conversion routine until TRDM corrects their oversight.
- **d.** <u>Revisions to DLM 4000.25 Manuals</u>: No update to DLMS Volume 6, Chapter 2. Will require update to the DoDAAD Series Table and Central Service Point (CSP) list accordingly (after implementation).
  - e. Alternatives: None
- **5. REASON FOR CHANGE:** Formerly known as United States Pacific Command (USPACOM) since its inception, the command was renamed to U.S. Indo-Pacific Command on May 30, 2018, in recognition of the increasing connectivity between the Indian and Pacific Oceans.

### 6. ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES:

- **a.** <u>Advantages</u>: Defense Secretary James Mattis officially changed the name to U.S. Indo-Pacific Command to reflect the growing importance of the Indian Ocean in U.S. strategic thinking.
  - **b. Disadvantages:** Will require a change to all programs that use the COCOM field.
- **7. ESTIMATED TIME LINE/IMPLEMENTATION TARGET:** Authorized for immediate implementation. Target timeline for DAAS updates to the DoDAAD is 90 days from the signature date of this ADC.
- **8. ESTIMATED SAVINGS/COST AVOIDANCE ASSOCIATED WITH IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS CHANGE:** The cost savings is unknown. The requirement is to implement mandated DOD name change.

#### 9. IMPACT:

- a. New DLMS Data Elements: None
- **b.** Changes to DLMS Data Elements: None.
- **c.** <u>Automated Information Systems (AIS)</u>: Any systems that acquire COCOM data from the DoDAAD will be impacted by this Change.

- **d.** <u>DAAS</u>: The COCOM is set by a stored procedure within the DoDAAD update application. The field is not manually entered, only displayed. Changes will be required to the following:
  - (1) DoDAAD Update to allow space to display fifteen character field.
  - (2) DAASINQ to allow space to display fifteen character field.
- (3) Dropdown list for eDAASINQ to select the new COCOM value for search and display fifteen character value in the results.
- (4) Any application within DAAS that uses the COCOM field. Additionally, all syndication of DoDAAD data will need to include this data field change.
- **e.** <u>FLIS Portfolio Data Warehouse (FPDW) Program Office</u>. Ensure these changes get implemented in all syndication of DoDAAD data from FPDW.
- **f.** <u>Army and Air Force</u>. Army and Air Force are expected to make the necessary changes to their respective DoDAAC applications to mirror these changes to the DoDAAD.
- **g.** Non-DLM 4000.25 Series Publications: The changes identified herein will need to be incorporated into the relevant Service/Agency-level DoDAAD management publications, including (but not limited to) the following:

(1) U.S. Army: AR 725-50

(2) U.S. Air Force: AFI 24-230

(3) U.S. Marine Corps: MCO 4400.201

(4) U.S. Coast Guard: COMDTINST M4000.2

(5) Defense Information Systems Agency: DISA Instruction 270-50-10

(6) Federal Property Management Regulations (CFR 41)
