3 REQUESTED CHANGE

3.1 BRIEF OVERVIEW OF CHANGE

As of February 1, 2019, the Republic of India received approval by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Allied Committee 135 (AC/135) to become a Tier 2 Country, allowing participation in the NATO Codification System (NCS). As a result, information must be added to Cataloging Data and Transaction Standards, Volume 10, Tables 9, 104 and 131, as well as Volume 13, Appendix 13-6-B to reflect India's NCS participation.

3.2 REQUESTED CHANGE IN DETAIL

3.2.1 Background

On February 1, 2019 AC/135 designated India as a Tier 2 Country. Becoming a Tier 2 country requires the sponsored nation, in this case India, to have a codification system certified as being fully compliant with NCS procedures. Tier 2 sponsorship also requires having a two-way data exchange and participation in technical NCS management. As a result, India must obtain MOE Rules in order to conduct transactional interchange.

3.2.2 National Codification Bureau (NCB) Code

CDTS, Volume 10, Table 9 contains the NCB Codes. These codes "identify the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) country or other foreign country which originally cataloged an item of supply." The NATO Cataloging team designated NCB Code 72 for India. This code allows India to establish National Stock Numbers (NSNs) and identification as the country of origination.

This change documents the addition of NCB Code 72 for India to CDTS, Volume 10, Table 9.

3.2.3 Activity Code for Authorized Originator/Submitter

CDTS, Volume 10, Table 104 contains Activity Codes and Major Organizational Entity (MOE) Codes for authorized originators and submitters. These codes identify activities authorized to submit and receive

Cataloging Transactions. Without this code, FLIS would not recognize India and therefore India could not submit transactions.

This change documents the addition of India as an authorized originator and submitter with Activity Code and MOE Code ZI to CDTS, Volume 10, Table 104.

3.2.4 NATO Commercial and Government Entity Code/Foreign Governments (NCAGE.FG) Codification Bureau Code

CDTS, Volume 10, Table 131 contains the NATO Commercial and Government Entity Code/Foreign Governments Codification Bureau Code. This table dictates the acceptable characters and numbers for composition of an NCAGE Code. The NATO Equivalent of a CAGE Code, the NCAGE Code, is a unique 5-character code assigned to suppliers or various government entities as a means of identifying a specific facility. NCAGE codes begin with a letter, and for India, this letter is specifically Y. Without this criterion, Indian companies and government entities could not register as suppliers or as design control entities for Part Numbers.

This change documents an update to the note associated with India in CDTS, Volume 10, Table 131 from Note 2 to Note 1, due to India now being a Tier 2 country.

3.2.5 Major Organizational Entity (MOE) Rule

Per CDTS, Volume 13, Chapter 6, "The MOE Rule Table, Appendix 13-6-B, reflects management responsibilities within participating Military Services, Civil Agencies, and NATO and other foreign countries. The information included in the MOE Rules is a combination of Department of Defense (DoD) and Service/Agency cataloging/supply management assignments which are made on the basis of organizational responsibilities."

The MOE Rules drive business rules for what a user can and cannot do on a National Stock Number (NSN). This addition establishes India as a Primary Inventory Control Activity (PICA) and utilizes NSNs where this MOE Rule is present. This support includes but may not be limited to providing assets from stock and specific means and/or location for the repair of items.

This change documents the addition of MOE Rule ZIO1 for India as the PICA in CDTS, Volume 13, Appendix 13-6-B.

3.3 REASON FOR CHANGE

These code additions enable India to participate in the NCS, establish their own National Stock Numbers (NSNs), and exchange information through the NCS.

- 2 In compliance with an Allied Committee agreement, the NCAGE Codification Bureau Code for this country shall not appear in FLIS. The NCAGE assigned by each country will be subject to replacement by an NCAGE containing an "S" prefix. (See Japan, South Africa, Argentina, Israel, Egypt, as examples.)
- 3 This is the prefix designator for an NCAGE assigned by the NATO Maintenance and Supply Agency (NAMSA) to replace the NCAGE of a non-NATO country or to identify a NATO or international organization, such as an international standards body. ("S") NCAGEs with this "P" or "S" prefix designate items produced in non-NATO countries or standards developed by a NATO or International organization ("P" prefix). U.S. activities may assign NSNs to and add reference numbers with "P" and "S" prefix CAGEs in the same manner as they do with reference numbers with U.S. CAGEs.
- 4 NATO Commercial and Government Entity Code (NCAGE) assigned to entities located in Canada have an "L" prefix designation, with Foreign/Domestic Designator Code of 2, if assigned after Canada implemented their modernized system in 2000.
