**Core Challenge:** Managing Government Furnished Property (GFP) effectively through a modernized Logistics IT (LogIT) strategy.

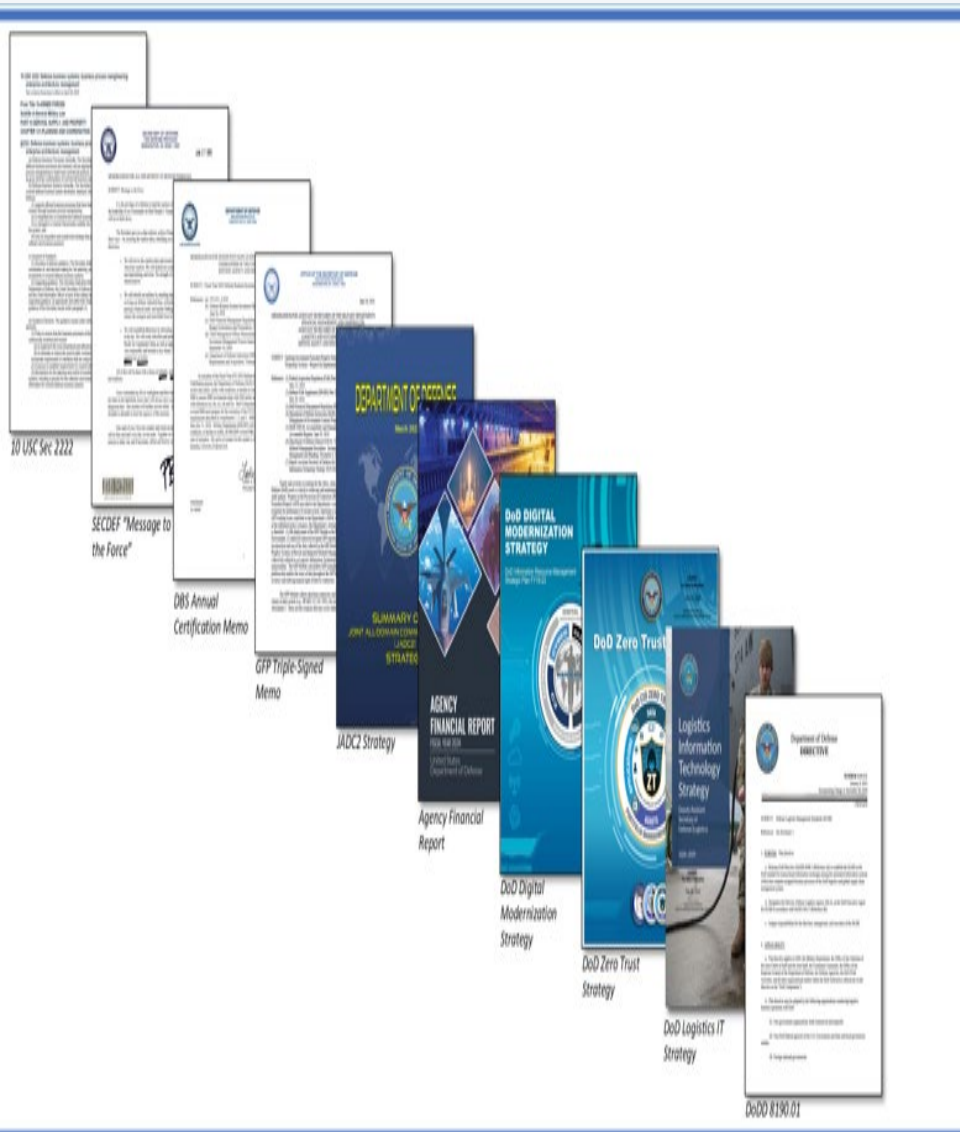
**Unified Compliance:** Ensure all military components have a unified, compliant method for tracking and accounting for government property while in the possession of contractors — crucial for operational readiness and financial accountability.

**Strategic Focus:** Standardizing processes across the Department of War (DoW), not just implementing new technology.



# Governing Policies, Mandates, and Regulations

Key federal laws and DoD policies mandating strict accountability and data standards



## 10 U.S.C. 2222

Requires DoD to implement the Business Enterprise Architecture (BEA) — a blueprint ensuring common standards for better decision-making and improved auditability.

## DoDD 8190.01E

Mandates transition from legacy data exchange formats to Defense Logistics Management Standards (DLMS), ensuring interoperability across all systems.

## DoDI 5000.64 & DoDM 4140.01 V11

Outlines required data elements for Accountable Property System of Record (APSR) and Inventory Material Management System (IMMS) — 36 APSR elements and 35 inventory elements.

## SecWar Audit Priority Memo

Sets specific timelines for integrating all relevant systems with the GFP Module to ensure comprehensive tracking and reporting.



# SecWar Mandate, DLMS Compliance, and ELMS Modernization



## SecWar Mandate

The Secretary of War has emphasized the urgency of this transition, mandating that all components meet compliance deadlines to achieve a clean audit opinion on the DoW's financial statements.

## DLMS Compliance

Achieving DLMS compliance means that logistics systems can "**speak the same language.**" For GFP, this is critical for tracking property as it moves between contractors, storage depots, and operational units.

## ELMS Modernization

ELMS (Enterprise Logistics Management System) represents the next generation of LogIT systems. Modernization involves replacing legacy systems with modern, cloud-based solutions that are inherently DLMS-compliant and support GFP accountability data requirements.



# GFP Modernization and DoW Integration

Four pillars of enterprise logistics modernization



## GFP Modernization and DoW Integration

### JLENT

*Joint Logistics Enterprise Network*

Functions as the overarching network where modernized systems operate, allowing ELMS and other logistics systems to share data seamlessly and securely.

### Component Actions

*Service & Agency Integration*

Each military service and agency must identify all LogIT systems handling GFP and develop a timeline for integrating them with the GFP Module, updating compliance data in the LOGIT-PCAT.

### Data Compliance

*36 APSR + 35 IMMS Elements*

The core effort is ensuring systems can capture, store, and transmit the 36 APSR and 35 inventory data elements, allowing for a complete and auditable record of all government property.

### System Rationalization

*BEA-Guided Consolidation*

Involves a review of all existing logistics systems to eliminate redundancies and consolidate functionalities into fewer, more capable systems, guided by the Business Enterprise Architecture.



# Path Forward: Full GFP Compliance & Audit Readiness

Three outcomes of full GFP and LogIT integration

## Full System Integration

---

All required logistics and financial systems must be fully integrated with the GFP Module and other enterprise systems through the JLEnt environment.

## Improved Decision-Making

---

With high-quality, standardized data from a modernized ELMS, leaders can make better decisions about asset visibility, maintenance, and procurement.

## Audit Readiness

---

A fully compliant and integrated system provides the evidence needed to pass financial audits, demonstrating responsible stewardship of taxpayer-funded resources and fulfilling the ultimate mandate from Congress and the SecDoW.
