Deputy Commander

Derrick L. White became the deputy commander of Defense Logistics Agency Distribution Anniston, Alabama, in Dec. 2021. He currently has 34 years of total active military/civilian service as property and supply chain manager for the United States Air Force and the Department of Defense.

White began his military career in June 1997 as a stock control manager at Osan Air Base, Republic of Korea. In Nov. 1998, he became the chief of Repair Processing Cell at North Atlantic Treaty Organization Headquarters, Allied Forces Northern Europe, Brunssum and the Netherlands.

White began his DLA career in April of 2002, where he became the joint liaison supervisor at Defense Reutilization and Marketing Service International at Livorno, Italy for two years.

After he became the joint liaison supervisor, White held different positions at Langley Air Force Base, Virginia, and at Ramstein Air Force Base, Germany. He then retired from active duty and attended the American Military University to complete a bachelor's degree in transportation and logistics management.

White then returned to DLA in 2013, when he became the chief of the Inventory Integrity Division and the Stock Readiness Coordinator for DLA Distribution Europe. In this position, he directed and coordinated all aspects of supply chain management through Inventory Integrity, asset management, and Care of Supplies in Storage for DLA Europe's 36,000 lines of material worth approximately \$135 million.

In Sept. 2016, White became the accountable officer for DLA Distribution Richmond, Virginia. In this position, he was accountable for all supply chain, demand planning, maintenance and administration of stock record accounts for two DLA Distribution Depots, totaling 80,000 separate line items occupying 1.5 million-gross-square-feet of storage space. He also performed random quality assurance checks to validate inventory accuracy rates on mandatory cyclic inventories for sensitive, hazardous and classified assets.
