Marine Corps Col. Kevin Chunn became the Defense Logistics Agency Distribution San Joaquin, California, commander June 17, 2022. Following his initial training as a Ground Supply Officer, he held a variety of billets in the Fleet Marine Force, supporting establishment and the joint community.
