

DLA Distribution Corpus Christi, Texas Lt. Col. Timothy J. Owens United States Army Commander

Army Lt. Col. Timothy J. Owens became the commander of Defense Logistics Agency Distribution Corpus Christi, Texas, June 27, 2023. His most recent assignment was with Joint Task Force National Capital Region as a joint logistics plans and operations officer in Washington, DC.

Owens is a native of East Hampton, Connecticut. He received a Reserve Officers' Training Corps scholarship to Virginia Tech where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and international relations. Upon graduating in 2004, Owens was commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant in the Transportation Corps.



Owens also holds a master's degree in business administration and a master of science degree in strategic management from Indiana University.

Owens arrived at Fort Drum, New York, in May 2005, where he was assigned to the 210th Brigade Support Battalion, 2nd Brigade Combat Team. In August 2006, he deployed with the 210th BSB for a 15-month rotation in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom f2006-08. Owens took command of Golf Battery-Forward Support Company, 2-15 Field Artillery and deployed with his company to Iraq in 2009 to support OIF 2009-10.

Upon graduation from the career course, Owens was assigned as an observer, coach/trainer at the Joint Readiness Training Center located in Fort Johnson, Louisiana. Owens was then stationed at Fort Gregg-Adams, Virginia, as a Project Warrior instructor for the Logistics Captains Career Course.

After graduating from the Command and General Staff College, Owens was again assigned to Fort Drum as the 10th Mountain Division transportation officer. As the DTO, he deployed with the division headquarters to Iraq as part of Combined Joint Task Force-Operation Inherent Resolve. Following the deployment, he served as the brigade logistics and planning officer for 1st Brigade Combat Team and the battalion executive officer for Army Field Support Battalion-Drum.

Owens was selected as an Interagency Fellow with the Agriculture Department and spent a year as a national security policy analyst in Washington, DC.

His awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal with one oak leaf cluster, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal with one oak leaf cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster, the Army Achievement Medal with two oak leaf clusters, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal and the Combat Action Badge.
