United States Army Maj. Edward P. Strzalkowski assumed duty as the Defense Logistics Agency Distribution Expeditionary Commander July 26, 2018 after serving as the Support Operations Officer, with 307th Brigade Support Battalion, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 82d Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

A native of Boiling Springs, Pennsylvania, Strzalkowski had 10 years of prior enlisted service in the Army and served with the 82nd Airborne Division, and 3rd Special Forces Group.

Strzalkowski graduated from Shippensburg University, Pennsylvania, with his Bachelors of Arts in Psychology. He is a graduate of the United States Army Officer Candidate School in Fort Benning, Georgia and was commissioned



Strzalkowski was first assigned to 10th Mountain Division, Fort Drum, New York where he served with Charlie Company, 710th Base Support Battalion, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, as a Medical Evacuation Platoon Leader; Fox Company, 710th BSB, as a Distribution Platoon Leader, and Company Executive Officer in support of 2nd Battalion, 87th Infantry Regiment "Catamounts" during which time he deployed to Afghanistan in 2006. Strzalkowski commanded a Forward Support Company in support of 3-10th General Support Aviation Battalion, 10th Combat Aviation Brigade, which deployed to Iraq in 2009.

Following command, he served as the Deliberate Plans and Operations Officer for the Exercise Division at the United States Army Combined Arms Support Command, Fort Lee, Virginia. His next assignment was with the Asymmetric Warfare Group where he served as a Troop Commander, and an Operational Advisor, which deployed to Afghanistan in 2013. He was then assigned to the 82d Airborne Division where he served as the G4 logistics planner; 1st Brigade Combat Team S4, and 307th BSB Support Operations Officer, which deployed to Afghanistan in 2017.

Strzalkowski's operational deployments include the Multi-National Force and Observers, Sinai, Egypt; Operation Joint Forge, Bosnia-Herzegovina; Operation Iraqi Freedom, Iraq; and Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan.

His personal decorations include the Bronze Star Medal with Double Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster, Meritorious Service Medal with Triple Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters, Army Commendation Medal with Triple Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters, and Army Achievement Medal with Four Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters.

His other awards include the Good Conduct Medal with Three Knots, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal Four Bronze Stars, Iraq Campaign Medal with Double Bronze Stars, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Army NCO Professional Development Ribbon with Numeral Three, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Ribbon with Numeral Three, NATO Medal with Triple Bronze Star, Multi-National Force and Observers Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Army Valorous Unit Award, and Army Meritorious Unit Citation with Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster.
