Army Lt. Col. Caleb S. Conant is a native of Rock Hill, South Carolina. He graduated from The Citadel in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science and obtained a Master of Arts in Transportation and Logistics Management in 2016. He also attended the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, from 2017 to 2018. Additionally, he attended the Joint and Combined Warfighting School at the Joint Forces Staff College in Norfolk, Virginia, where he completed his qualifications to become a Joint Qualified Officer.

Prior to this assignment, he served as an observer, coach, and trainer at the Mission Command Training Program from 2023 to 2025.



Conant's operational experience began as a distribution platoon leader, maintenance platoon Leader, and executive officer for Foxtrot Forward Support Company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 30<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment (Light) Fort Johnson, Louisiana, from 2008 to 2011, where he had two combat deployments to Iraq and Afghanistan. After completing the Combined Logistics Captains Career Course in 2012, he served as the operations and logistics officer, 690<sup>th</sup> Rapid Port Opening Element, Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command, Fort Eustis, Virginia, from 2012 to 2014. Lt. Col. Conant served as the Company Commander of the 567<sup>th</sup> Inland Cargo Transfer Company, 7<sup>th</sup> Transportation Brigade (Expeditionary), Fort Eustis, Virginia, from 2014 to 2016. After completing his company command time, he served as an observer, coach, and trainer, 1<sup>st</sup> Army Division West, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 393<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Regiment, Fort Cavazos, Texas, until becoming a student at the Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, from 2017-2018. After graduating, he served as the regimental logistics officer and regimental support operations officer for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Cavalry Regiment (Stryker), Vilseck, Germany. After his tour in Germany, he moved to Norfolk, Virginia, where he served as a joint sustainment planner as part of the U.S. Transportation Command, Joint Enabling Capabilities Command.

His awards and decorations include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal (three awards), the Joint Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal (six awards), and the Army Achievement Medal (four awards), as well as various unit awards, campaign medals, and ribbons. He is also a recipient of the Military Order of Saint Christopher.
