United States Marine Corps Col. Tiffany N. Harris was born in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. She received her bachelor of arts in psychology from Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania and was commissioned through the Platoon Leader Combined Class in 1995. Following the Basic School and the Ground Supply Officer Course, she was assigned to 1st Medical Battalion, 1st Force Service Support Group in October 1996. During this tour Harris served as the battalion supply officer.

In March 1998, she reported to Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) Service Support Group-13 for deployment with the 13th MEU December 1998. While deployed with 13th MEU, Harris participated in Exercise Eager Mace in Kuwait. After returning from a Western Pacific deployment in June 1998, she reported to the Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego where she served as the property control officer and the executive officer and commanding officer of Receiving Barracks Company.

In July 2002, she reported to Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, North Carolina, for duty as the supply officer for Marine Air Control Group-28. While serving with MACG-28, Harris deployed to Al Asad Air Base, Iraq, as the Group S-4 (supply officer). She was promoted to Maj. in August 2015 and upon completion of the deployment, she transferred to the 2nd Force Service Support Group as the commanding officer/supply management unit officer in charge for Supply Company, 2nd Supply Battalion. While with 2nd Supply Battalion, Harris deployed to Al-Taqaddam, Iraq as the supply detachment commander.

After returning from Taqaddam in October 2007, Harris transferred to Marine Forces Command in Norfolk, Virginia, as the force material readiness officer. While serving with Marine Forces Command, Harris deployed to Afghanistan as an individual augment to Combat Logistics Regiment-2 in February 2009. She served in Afghanistan as the supply management unit officer in charge. After returning from deployment, she was selected for lieutenant colonel and transferred to the Joint Staff/J-5 (strategic planning and policy) for duty with the U.S. Mission to the United Nations in New York City as the a deputy military advisor.

Harris transferred from New York to the 1st Marine Logistics Group, Camp Pendleton, California, for duty as the Deputy G3 (plans) from September 2013 through February 2014. In February 2014, she assumed command of 1st Supply Battalion. Following her battalion command tour, she was selected the Academic Year 2016 Marine Corps Fellow to the U.S. Agency for International Development. During her fellowship, Harris worked on policy issues in Asia Bureau. She was selected to colonel and transferred to 3D Marine Logistics Group in Okinawa, Japan, for duty as the assistant chief of staff G3 (plans).

Harris' personal decorations include the Joint Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (5th award), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (3rd award).
