Juneteenth

On Friday, June 18, 2021, the federal government recognized Juneteenth (June 19) as a federal holiday for the first time in our nation's history. The <u>President's Proclamation</u> noted, "Juneteenth

is a day of profound weight and power."

Here are a few excerpts from the proclamation:

On June 19, 1865 — nearly nine decades after our Nation's founding, and



more than 2 years after President Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation — enslaved Americans in Galveston, Texas, finally received word that they were free from bondage. As those who were formerly enslaved were recognized for the first time as citizens, Black Americans came to commemorate Juneteenth with celebrations across the country, building new lives and a new tradition that we honor today. In its celebration of freedom, Juneteenth is a day that should be recognized by all Americans. And that is why I am proud to have consecrated Juneteenth as our newest national holiday.

On Juneteenth, we recommit ourselves to the work of equity, equality, and justice. And, we celebrate the centuries of struggle, courage, and hope that have brought us to this time of progress and possibility. That work has been led throughout our history by abolitionists and educators, civil rights advocates and lawyers, courageous activists and trade unionists, public officials, and everyday Americans who have helped make real the ideals of our founding documents for all.

There is still more work to do. As we emerge from the long, dark winter of the COVID-19 pandemic, for example, racial equity remains at the heart of our efforts to vaccinate the Nation and beat the virus. We must recognize that Black Americans, among other people of color, have shouldered a disproportionate burden of loss — while also carrying us through disproportionately as essential workers and health care providers on the front lines of the crisis.

Juneteenth not only commemorates the past. It calls us to action today.

IT Reconstitution preparation

DLA IT is proactively working to ensure the transition back into the office is as smooth as possible. Here are a few IT items to be aware of when that time comes:

- Bring your computer with you to the office just in case your zero client has issues.
- Use your dock station to access the network. If you need a docking station or other computer accessory submit a SPOE ticket.
- If you can't connect, try <u>connecting to the UMC</u> <u>wireless network where available.</u> Or <u>use your iPhone</u> <u>hotspot for temporary network access.</u>
- Before logging into your computer on site, reset your desk phone (unplug the Ethernet cable/"LAN" on the phone and plug it back in). After the reset, <u>log into</u> <u>your extension mobility profile</u>.
- Adjust your monitor settings if needed.
- Reconnect printers.
