Shadow experiences are designed to provide participants with professional development opportunities, professional networks, meaningful career conversations, exposure to leadership at multiple levels, and a broader understanding of DLA Energy.

Participants are not the only ones to benefit from the Shadow Program. DLA Energy leaders benefit by fostering a coaching culture and increase transparency of Energy's business strategies.

Bulk Petroleum Products' Callie Ettleson Lake shadowed Kevin Ahern in February 2018 when Ahern was Acting Director of Procurement Process Support.

"I chose to shadow the **Procurement Process Support** Division in hopes that it would give me a bigger picture of
