During this period, Ms. Antonesei conducted a data call with eight service providers supporting employees in 12 locations and put together a consolidation plan to reduce agreements by 50% prior to the Oct. 1 G-Invoicing deadline and reduce funding



requirements within the region by 25%. She also helped maintain the \$2.1M budget and Billing Official duties for eight government purchase card holders without incident working after-hours to synchronize with headquarters.

Q&A

Is there an official policy on making up days when not in the office due to leave, sick leave or MDO reasons?



Answer: There is no official policy. However, supervisors should be looking for trends. For example, if an employee happens to be requesting leave, requesting situational telework, etc. for every time they should be in the office, they should address it.

Why can people go back into the office but not re-institute the Physical Fitness Program in HPCON-B locations?

Answer: While we are in HPCON-B, our employees onsite are very limited, and most are likely not coming in more than 2 days a pay period. The DLA Director made the decision to reinstitute fitness at HPCON A as we will be "a little" closer to normal operations.

What is the benchmark for having to wear masks?

Answer: If the CDC community level changes to high, then the HPCON level would change to Charlie and masks would be required. The HPCON level at the HQC is B because the CDC level for this area is currently medium.
