

CONSENT TO SEARCH

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

1. AUTHORITY: Section 21, Internal Security Act of 1950 (*Public Law 831, 81st Congress.*)
2. PURPOSE: Used to gain permission to search individual residences and personal property to identify and acquire contraband or physical evidence.
3. ROUTINE USES: Information may be disclosed for those routine uses listed in DLA System Notices S160.50DLA-I and S161.60DLA-I as follows: To a court of competent jurisdiction where criminal action is taken. It may also be used for any of the DLA blanket routine uses set forth at the beginning of DLA's listing of systems of records notices.
