The NATO Stock Number



A NATO Stock Number (NSN) is simply an official label applied to an item of supply. The NATO Codification System (NCS) is a uniform and common system for the identification, classification and stock numbering of items of supply.

Objectives of the NCS include:

- Facilitate interoperability between user nations
- Increase the effectiveness of user nation's logistics systems
- Minimize logistics costs of user nations
- Facilitate data handling

The NSN is recognized by the United States government, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), and Partner Nations.

The Power of the NATO Master Catalogue of Reference for Logistics (NMCRL)

Based on the NATO standards, the NMCRL is the only common, up-to-date and user-friendly platform for logistical data of defence equipment for the participating member countries, as well as for their defence industry. With high data quality, it ensures the supply chain of military logistical support from the aspect of the "right part". The NMCRL thus contributes to the benefit of the participating nations, their defence industry, as well as NATO. The NMCRL exists as a real time database on the Internet (NMCRL-Web) and as an offline database for use on any computer not connected to the Internet (NMCRL-Offline). As the primary logistics tool for NATO and AC/135 sponsored countries, the NMCRL provides a catalogue of the materiel they use. NMCRL is a database containing all NSNs worldwide and varies from the FED LOG product which consists mainly of United States National Stock Numbers and NATO Stock Numbers used by the United States. Federal Logistics Data on Mobile Media (FED LOG®)

FED LOG® provides users the ability to access Federal Logistics Information System (FLIS) data during instances when internet connectivity is non-available. FED LOG® provides essential information about items of supply to include the National/NATO Stock Number (NSN), the Approved and Non Approved Item Name, Manufacturers and Distributors information (to include Part Numbers), Freight Data, Hazardous Materiel Indicators, Interchangeable and Substitutable data, Acquisition Advice Code (AAC) and Unit Price, Physical and Performance Characteristics along with service specific management data. Public Logistics Data on Mobile Media (PUB LOG®)

PUB LOG® is a Logistics Information Services product intended for use by public entities requiring National/NATO Stock Number (NSN) information and other cataloging information including Federal Supply Classification (FSC) data and Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) codes. PUB LOG® delivers publicly releasable logistics information. It is an interactive product available for free downloads that are updated monthly. It can be installed on users' workstations or local area network (LAN) using Integrated Mobile Database (IMD) software, integrating multiple database sources.
