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General Information

- Use of monthly orders vs quarterly
- Moving toward SPRS 3 year score vs 2 year manual review
- Emphasis on timely delivery and moving toward Past Performance being more important than PDM
- Movement to tiered pricing vs options to reduce risk of not being able to meet option minimums
- Agency tracking Unliquidated Obligations (ULO) more closely to better manage financials
- Emphasis on working any defective product issues through the return to vendor process, holding contractors accountable and preserving taxpayer dollars

- Overboots, Molded, Lightweight, Chemical/Biological Protective (MALO)
- Gloves – Butyl, JB2GU, Glove Inserts
- Toxicological Agent Protective Items (TAP)
- Joint Service Lightweight Integrated Suit Technology (JSLIST)
- Joint Protective Aircrew Ensemble (JPACE)
- Chemical Protective Helmet Covers

Product Line Overview

- Items currently procured are for Warfighters only.
- Items subject to International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR).
- DLA supports two major customers:
 - Individual Chemical Equipment Management Program (ICEMP). Office provides centralized management and funding of U.S. Army chemical individual protective equipment.
 - Military Service War Reserve Stocks.

Program POCs

- Joint Program Executive Office for Chemical and Biological Defense (JPEO-CBD) – responsible for research, development, acquisition, fielding, and life-cycle support of chemical and biological equipment and medical countermeasures. It focuses on the protection of Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, and Marines from chemical and biological weapons on the battlefield.
- Joint Project Manager for Protection (JPM P) – one of eight JPMs under JPEO-CBD, provides DoD and other federal customers, with the protection requires to effectively conduct active combat, consequence management, and homeland defense operations in CBRN environments.

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Improved Combat Vehicle Crewman (iCVC) Coverall



Where We Were:

- Improved Combat Vehicle Crewman (iCVC) Coverall
 - Requirements generated in 1977
 - There is a low demand for the uniform; Soldiers state the one-piece uniform is hot and impedes mobility

Where We Are Going:

- Maneuver Capability Development Integration Directorate (MCDID) developing requirement for an Advanced Combat Vehicle Crewman (aCVC) Uniform
 - Partnering with USMC for a common **Warfighter** solution
 - PM SCIE will develop an acquisition approach to fulfill requirements anticipated to be approved 4QFY21

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Multipurpose Personal Hydration System (MPHS)



Where We Are:

- Provides Soldiers the ability to hydrate in a Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) environment
- Adapters compatible with M50 and M40 masks
- MPHS can be used for **12 months in a threat environment** (previously 30 days)
- MPHS resists Chemical Warfare Agent permeation for **up to 12 hours** (previously 6 hours)
- MPHS system resisted permeation by **Toxic Industrial Chemicals/Toxic Industrial Materials for 12 hours**
- Successfully completed 4 years of shelf-life testing

Where We Are Going:

- Looking at possible ways to enhance the use of MPHS in extreme cold weather environments
- Conduct 5-year shelf-life testing

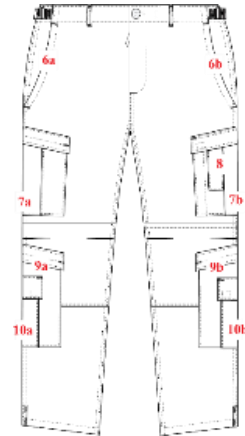
BACKGROUND:

- Fit evaluation of unisex Advanced Aircrew Combat Uniform (A2CU) validated need for female sizes for comfort and safety
- Design will mirror unisex design with modifications required for smaller sizes



INTERIM SOLUTION:

- MASSIF® 2-Piece Flight Suit is a current commercially available solution to better accommodate female aircrews
- Approved interim Safe to Fly (iStF) for non-ejection female aircrew



PERMANENT SOLUTION:

- Develop female fit for A2CU due to poor female fit of unisex A2CU
- Government owned design
- Common Solution for AF, Army, and Navy



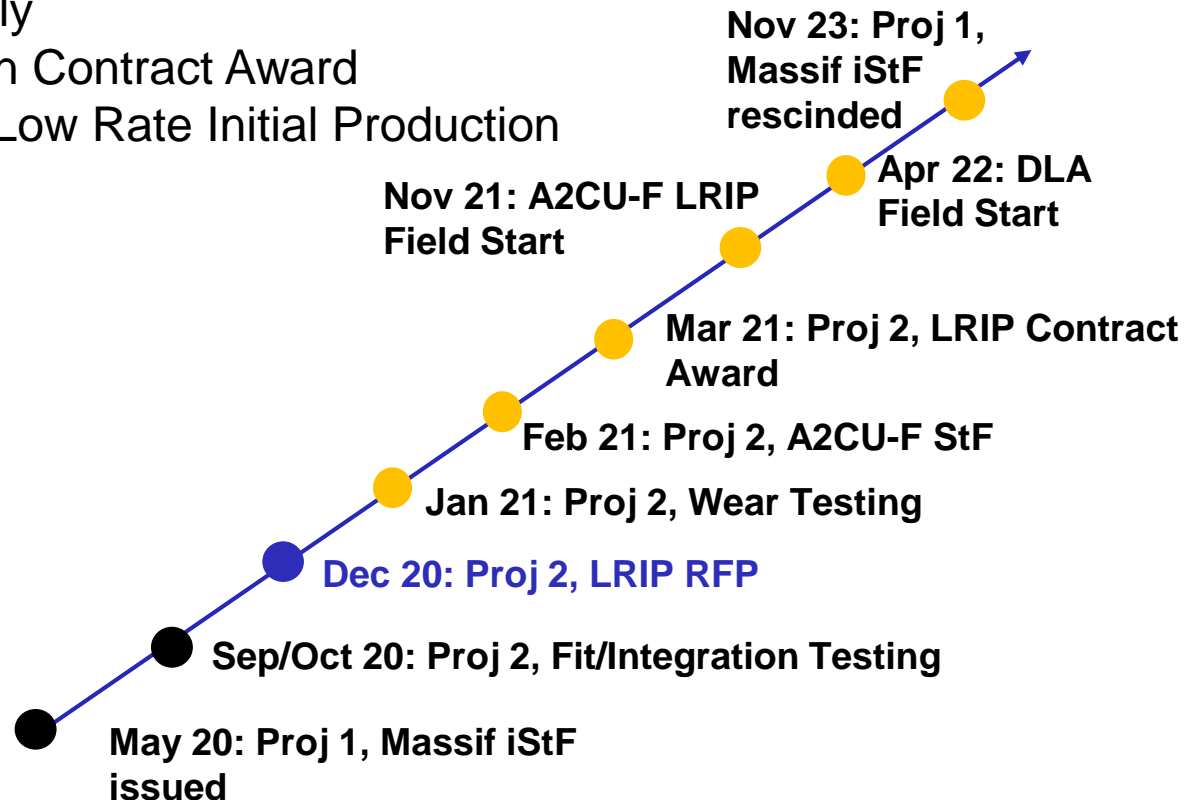

- Nov 21: Begin Fielding Low Rate Initial Production
- Apr 22: DLA Field





Maternity Flight Duty Uniform Overview



AFLCMC... Providing the Warfighter's Edge

BACKGROUND:

- Develop flight suit to accommodate pregnant aircrew through pregnancy and post-pregnancy due to policy change
- Each year there are approximately 400 pregnant females in need of a Maternity Flight Suit

INTERIM SOLUTION:

- Support safe in-house modifications to existing 27/P design
- Requires PEO/ACS & operational community risk acceptance

PERMANENT SOLUTIONS:

- Develop maternity fit for 27/P to accommodate females through entire pregnancy and post wear
- Long term development of FR stretch fabric and maternity 2-piece design
- Common Solution for AF, Army, and Navy

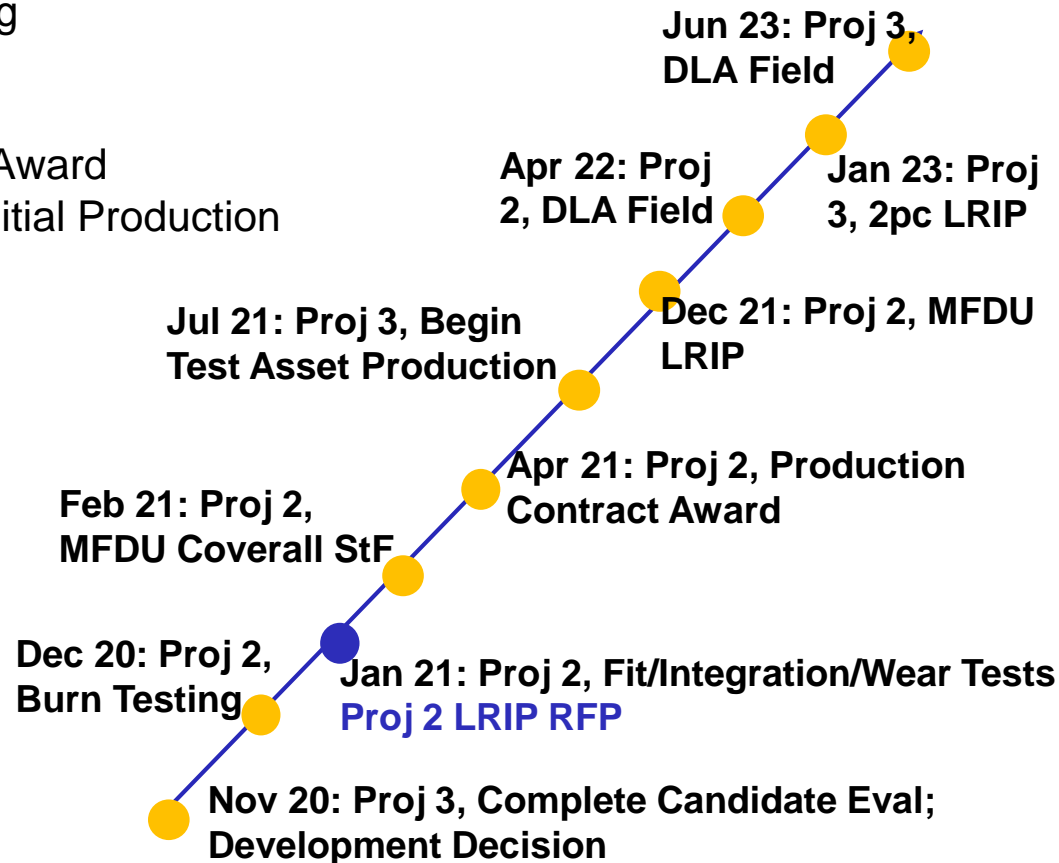

Project 2 – First Final Solution, Maternity FDU Coverall

- Dec 20: Burn Testing
- Jan 21: Fit/Integration/Wear Testing
LRIP RFP on Beta Sam
- Feb 21: Issue Safe-to-Fly
- Apr 21: LRIP Production Contract Award
- Dec 21: Begin Fielding Low Rate Initial Production
- Apr 22: DLA Field

Project 3 – Second Final Solution, Maternity 2-piece FDU

- Sept-Feb: Prototype development
- Nov 20: Complete Government RFI evaluation of commercial fabric candidate; Decide if stretch fabric development needed
- Jul 21: Begin asset production for Fit/Wear/Integration Testing
- Jan 23: Begin Fielding Low Rate Initial Production
- Jun 23: DLA Field
