Army Combat Shirt (ACS)



Where We Are:

- Advanced Combat Shirt (ACS)
 - Available to deploying Soldiers
 - No means to replenish
 - Now, transitioning to DLA-TS for sustainment
 - Placed on Army Direct Order (ADO)
 - Allows Units to procure directly for Soldiers
 - Available for other Services, approved for use

Where We Are Going:

- Fit – issues with seam construction in upper torso
 - Potential for irritation under body armor
- Partnered with NC State to identify improved manufacturing methods
 - Investigating whole garment knitting
 - Improving current FR capability
 - Reducing production cost
 - Improving fit





Army Combat Pant (ACP)



Where We Were:

- Army Combat Pant (ACP)
 - Subject to proprietary design issues
 - Could not transition to DLA for sustainment



Where We Are Going:

- Integrating new technologies, developed by Natick Soldier Research, Development, and Engineering Center (NSRDEC)
 - FR Thread
 - Improved kneepad
- Current prototype development by NSRDEC
 - Once technologies are tested and proven, Purchase Descriptions (PD) will be updated to reflect requirement





Improved Combat Vehicle Crewman Uniform (iCVC)



Where We Were:

- Improved Combat Vehicle Crewman Uniform (iCVC)
 - Requirements generated in 1977
 - Extremely low demand
 - Soldiers prefer Flame Resistant Army Combat Uniform (FR ACU)

Where We Are Going:

- Joined with Maneuver Center of Excellence and Mounted Soldier Command to revalidate requirements
- Options to explore:
 - Maintain as-is
 - Update requirements and uniform
 - Eliminate iCVC from inventory and utilize another garment(s) currently in inventory that meet validated requirements

AFLCMC... Providing the Warfighter's Edge

- 14 May 2018 CSAF announced AF will transition from AF Airmen Battle Uniform (ABU) utility uniform into the Army's Operational Camouflage Pattern (OCP) uniform



AF Airman Battle Uniform (ABU) Digital Tiger Stripe color pattern 50/50 Nylon /Cotton "ripstop" cloth

1 OCT	Serviceable OCP's may be worn with current patches/badges Airmen can purchase OCP's at the following AAFES locations: Asiano AB, Charleston AFB, Shaw AFB and MacDill AFB, Pentagon

1 APR	Expansion of in-store AAFES sales locations continues
OCT	Online sales projected to be available
2020	
1 JUN	Coyote brown boots mandatory Coyote brown/tan 499 T-Shirt mandatory U.S. Flag spice brown color criteria mandatory Spice brown officer rank mandatory DLA green socks/coyote brown socks mandatory
2021	
1 APR	OCP Utility Uniform mandatory All AF patches must be converted to the spice brown color criteria

- The OCP works in all climates and across the spectrum of missions we perform
- Over 100,000 Airmen have been issued and/or are already wearing OCP's. This includes AFCENT, AFSOC and our AFGSC Defenders
- The OCP will bring back Air Force heraldry with unit patches
- The OCP celebrates our joint warfighting excellence and close ties with the Army

AF Camouflage Uniforms Cold Weather OCP Transition

AF Cold Weather System impacts

- **New AF demand for Gen III ECWCS Cold Weather**
 - Fleece Jacket **(Layer 3) coyote** will replace AF sage color
 - Extreme Cold Weather Jacket **(layer 6) in OCP** will replace the AF All Purpose Environmental Clothing (APEC) jacket and pants
- **AF is already using the following depending on Unit and location:**
 - Undershirt and cold weather drawers **(Layer 1) tan or sand**
 - Mid-weight shirt and cold weather drawers **(Layer 2) tan or sand**
 - Cold Weather Jacket and Trousers **(Layer 5) in OCP**
 - Extreme Cold Weather Parka and Trousers **(Layer 7) in gray**
- **DLA Inventory needs to be ramped up to stock for AF; will fill orders over time based on AF directed priorities**
