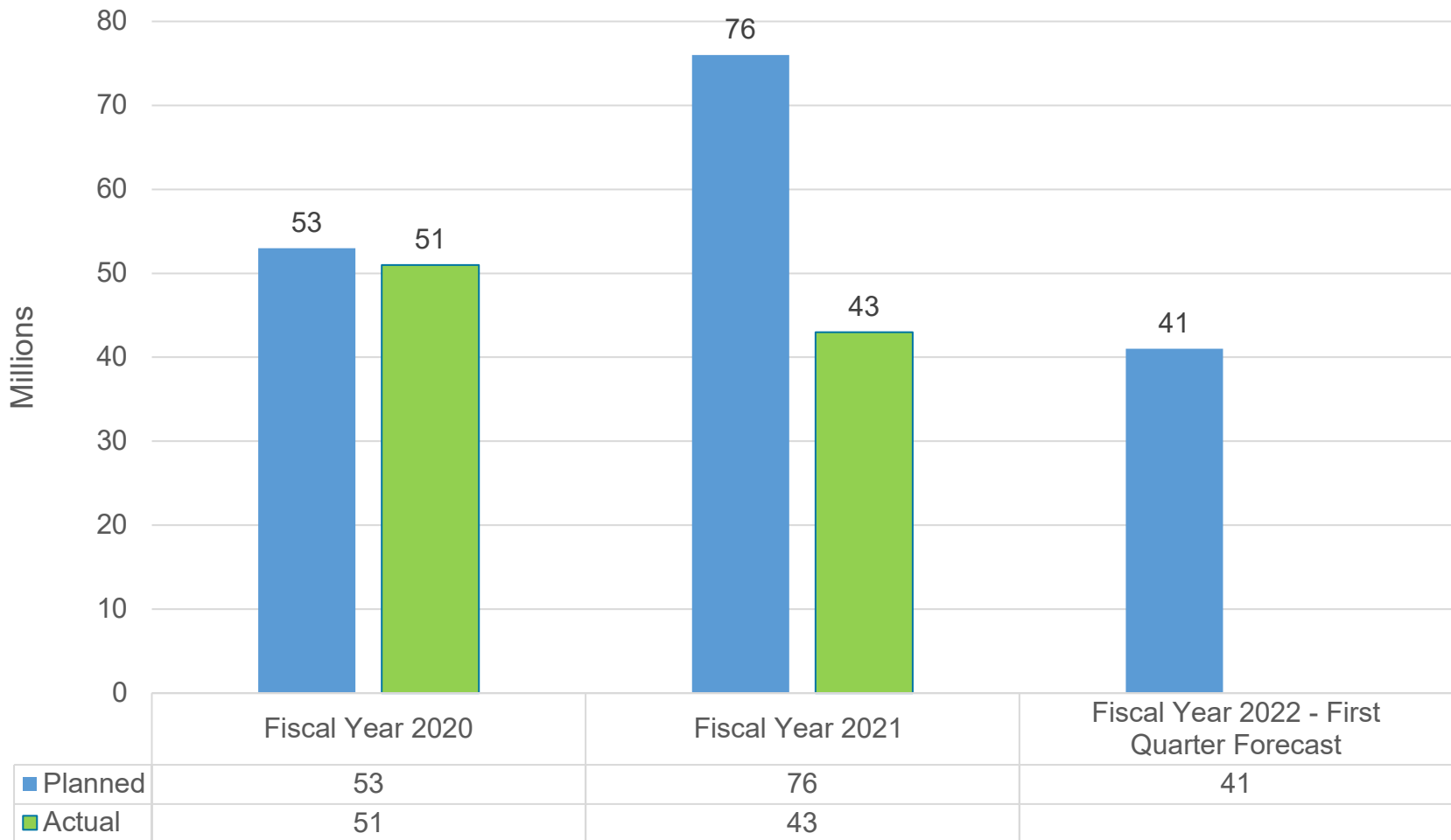

OPTION PRICING VS. TIER PRICING

- Base and Option Year Contract Pricing vs. Tier Contract Pricing
 - The tier contract pricing approach embraces the concept of a multi-year ordering period with a single Guaranteed Minimum Quantity and a single Contract Maximum Quantity for the life of the contract.
 - The base and option contract pricing approach embraces the concept of a base year ordering period with an option to extend the term for multiple years, one additional year at a time. There are multiple Guaranteed Minimum Quantities and Maximum Quantities, one of each per year.
 - Guaranteed Minimum Quantity - Generally 25% of Annual Estimated Quantity (AEQ) and applies to both. However, for tier pricing, only the first tier/year has a Guaranteed Minimum Quantity.
 - Maximum Quantity - Generally 125% of AEQ and applies to both.
 - Maximum Monthly Quantity – Applies to both.
 - Ordering - Quarterly delivery orders apply to both.



BASE ACCESS

- DLA Troop Support Base Access
 - Effective October 1, 2021, all carriers/individuals attempting to deliver any packages, proposals, etc. to DLA Troop Support SHALL have present credentials that meet “REAL ID” requirements in order to gain access to make a delivery. NO EXCEPTIONS SHALL BE MADE.



PTACs

- Procurement Technical Assistance Centers (PTACs) provide local, in-person counseling and training services for small business owners that want to sell products/services to federal, state, and/or local governments. They are designed to provide technical assistance to include the following:
 - Help facilitate communication among businesses, Small Business programs, and Government contracting representatives.
 - Provide information and education on Federal and other Government acquisition regulations, procedures, procurement terminology, and best practices.
 - Help businesses identify contract/bid opportunities, procurement history, suppliers, subcontractors, and any other information needed to successfully compete for a contract
 - Offer seminars, classes, individual counseling, and agency specific training on security requirements, bid software, etc.

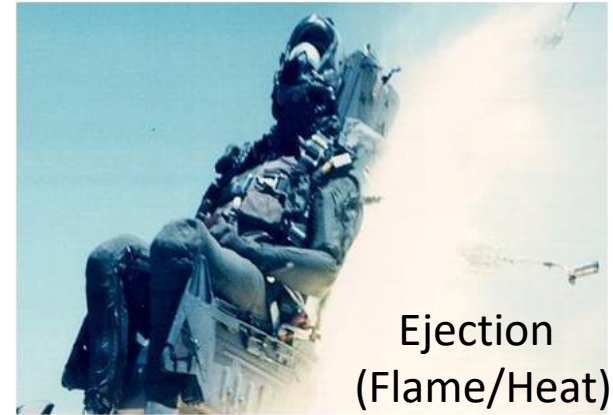

Improved Cold Weather Glove Aviation Requirements



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Potential
Multi-Service Common
Solution Initiative

- Provide Heat/Flame Protection, and No Melt No Drip
- Environmental Protection **-65F** (-54C) ambient / and **windchill -140F** (-96.5C)
- **Not degrade tactility/ dexterity** required to flight mission tasks, emergency egress
- Enable Commercial Mobile Device **touch screen** operated by touching (Desired) without causing any delay, or contact error, or miscommunication, vs bare hand)
- **Not become stiff or crack** under cold environment that interferes with its use, wear life, durability, required protection, and/or dexterity performances
- Fit 5th to 95th percentile population for both men's and women's sizing
- **AF may leverage new NAVAIR specification for New CW Flyer Gloves**
- **Testing 2 different HEATED glove candidates including Army SBIR Gloves**



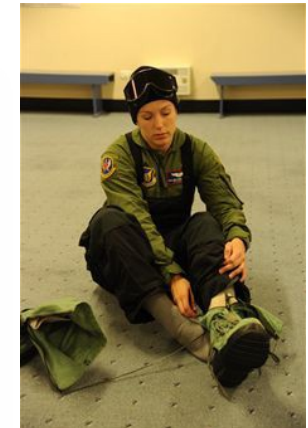

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Aircraft Maintainers / Aviators

- 1) Head and Neck Protection
- 2) Face Protection
- 3) Eye Protection
- 4) Upper Torso Extremity Protection (Jacket/Parka, Thermal Underlayers)
- 5) Extreme Cold Hand Protection
- 6) Lower Torso Extremity Protection (Trousers, Thermal Underlayers)
- 7) Foot and Lower Leg Protection, Boot: (-149F) includes protection from liquid O and N
- 8) Foot and Lower Leg Protection, Sock
- 9) Tailorable and scalable
- 10) Maneuverability and Scalability
- 11) POL Resistant and Repellent
- 12) Flame protection, and no melt/no drip on skin
- 13) Moisture Management
- 14) Foreign Object Debris (FOD) protection, no loose parts, snags
- 15) Eliminate/Mitigate Static Spark explosion risk

AF Cold Weather Handwear Combat Ready Airmen

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Multi-Service
Common Solution
Initiative!

- USAF requirement to modernize the **Cold Weather Handwear System** in Mobility Bag
- AF CWGS shall provide environmental protection:
 - 40°F to -40°F Threshold (T), 40°F to -60°F or below Objective (O)
 - CWGS shall **not melt or drip** when exposed to heat or flame at the next to skin level and **self-extinguish** once the heat or flame is removed (O) Objective.
- AF Security Forces conducted Limited User Evals (LUE) in AK
- **Army program** CW system candidates Jan – Apr 20
- **USMC program** CW Handwear system Feb – Apr 21
- Govt design is closest to meeting operability, durability, HF rqmts
- USAF may require **COTS for mobility bag in the interim using CW Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) or DLA TLS**

Government owned handwear designs pictured below are new USMC developed items which will replace legacy items through attrition:

▪Extreme Cold Weather (ECW) Mitten Systems

- Government owned design – sustainable
- Type 1 – Full Mitten Shell
- Type 2 – Trigger Finger Mitten Shell
- TF Liner developed for better dexterity; used with both shells



▪Intermediate Cold Weather Glove (ICWG)

- Government owned design – sustainable
- Provides additional warmth and durability compared to current:
 - Increased insulation
 - Longer cuff
 - Increased leather at knuckles, 1st finger, and thumb crotch (patch)
