- e. In performance of this contract, any transportation of supplies by sea must comply with DFARS 252.247-7023, Transportation of Supplies by Sea Basic (FEB 2019)
- f. Diesel Aircraft Cooling Unit models HPCX-DM and AGILE AIR-70 are excluded from the basic contract.
- g. The product base list unit prices set forth in the contractor's proposal dated June 13, 2019, and the final proposal discounts dated January 9, 2020, are applicable to the items specified in this contract and are shown on page 11 of this contract.

The proposed product base list unit prices are from Wright & Wright Manufacturing Co Inc.'s Commercial Price List.




