The negotiated discounts on page 13 of this contract shall remain in effect for the entire five-year contract period. The contract pricing (catalog price minus discount) shall be the ceiling price for any delivery order awarded under the contract. At any time, the contractor can offer discounts greater than the contractual discounts.




