Major General Mark T. Simerly, United States Army, is being inducted into the Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support Hall of Fame, Class of 2021 for his outstanding mission support from July 2017 to June 2019. During this time, Maj. Gen. Simerly served as Commander, Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support, and distinguished himself as an exceptional leader. Maj. Gen. Simerly's outstanding leadership resulted in major contributions to the national security of the United States and to those in need due to an unprecedented hurricane season.

While in command, Maj. Gen. Simerly's untiring pursuit of excellence was vital in his uncompromising commitment to readiness, customer satisfaction, stewardship, and innovation. Maj. Gen. Simerly's ability to be a change leader, with the workload of five separate and distinct supply chains (Clothing & Textiles, Construction & Equipment, Medical, Subsistence, and Industrial Hardware), each with their own challenges, solidified his reputation for excellence.
