Raymond (Ray) G. Miller was inducted into the Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support Hall of Fame Nov. 21, 2017 for his outstanding mission support from 1976 through 2011. Mr. Miller dedicated his entire federal career of 35 years to DLA Troop Support and its legacy organizations, where he helped propel the organization as the Department of Defense's premiere supplier of choice due to its cost saving initiatives and innovative supply method solutions.

Mr. Miller culminated his career as the deputy director of Subsistence wherein he managed the acquisition, logistics and overall worldwide support of subsistence items including prime vendor items, rations, produce, market-ready items and food service equipment. Upon his retirement, Subsistence's support totaled \$4.7 billion in annual sales with operations running 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year, providing direct deliveries in war zones, and frequent contingency and emergency support requirements.

Mr. Miller successfully served in several managerial positions throughout DLA Troop Support including Medical commissary support branch chief, Construction and Equipment deputy director and director of operations, and Subsistence program manager for continental U.S. and overseas prime vendor support. Within this position, he was instrumental in the design, contracting, implementation, rollout and management of Subsistence prime vendor contracts as well as the integration of fresh fruits and vegetables, and local market-ready contracts for a total subsistence support package.

Through his work ethics, dedication, and ingenuity, Mr. Miller was an inspiring leader, earning the respect, trust and confidence of his workforce, customers and industry partners. His commitment to warfighter support has left a lasting impression on not just DLA Troop Support, but DLA and the Department of Defense.
