Mr. Dudek was an outstanding logistician whose vision and willingness to explore new and better ways of doing business brought change and improved practices, as well as numerous accolades to DLA Troop Support and the entire Defense Logistics Agency. Although he spent most of his career in Clothing and Textiles, he also served as the director of the Business Systems Modernization Office and the Electronic Commerce Office.
