I. SOLICITATION/CONTRACT FORM

The terms and conditions set forth in the solicitation SPE300-22-R-0039 are incorporated into subject contract.

The following documents are incorporated by reference into the subject contract: your initial offer dated September 7, 2022, which is being accepted by the Government to form this contract.

II. PERFORMANCE PERIOD:

A. Effective Period of the Contract:

Tier 1: December 22, 2022 through June 21, 2024 Tier 2: June 22, 2024 through December 21, 2025

The total 10% Guaranteed Minimum contract dollar value is \$832,850.00 and the 200% Maximum contract dollar value is \$49,971,000.00. The guaranteed minimum and maximum, although based on estimates, are a firm dollar amount calculated as a percentage of the estimated dollar value. The guaranteed minimum constitutes the Government's legal ordering obligation under the contract.

The 18 Month (1st Tier) Estimate is \$12,492,750.00 and the 3 Year (All Tiers) Estimate is \$24,985,500.00. The term "3 Year Estimate" refers to the Government's good faith estimate of the requirement for all Tier periods.

III. START-UP PERIOD

An additional sixty (60) days will be granted for actual implementation. No more than ninety (90) days after

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award will be permitted for the contractor to have fully functional distribution accounts in place for all customers.

aggregate of contract Delivered Price increases for each line item on the catalog subject to this provision shall not exceed 90 percent (%) for USDA Upper Michigan and Wisconsin School and Reservation customers above that line item's initial Delivered Price on the awarded catalog. To further illustrate this point, Attachment 1 (Final Pricing) includes a separate column that identifies the percentage EPA ceiling for the individual Delivered Prices of each line item on the catalog. This price represents the maximum increase in Delivered Price allowable for the entire 3-year length of the Contract.
