Section I: Correction to amendment 0002

1. On the top of page 5 of amendment 0002, within item number 7, under Section II; pipeline pallet spaces for Zone 1 is corrected to read as 3,300 American sized pallets spaces (48 x 40 inches) for Zone 1. Zone 2 is corrected to read as 4,500 American sized pallets spaces (48 x 40 inches).

Section II: Additional Vendor questions that have come in post the pre-proposal question period.

1. Ref amendment 5- Q5 Page 4 of 13

Prime Vendor product is currently brought into Kenya via DTS, and is picked up by a third party logistics company. However, going forward the Prime Vendor will be responsible for all transportation to the customer.

Please clarify "all transportation to the customer". Does this mean from airport in Kenya to customer or does that include inbound flights?

DLA Troop Support Response: As stated above product is brought into Kenya via DTS so the Prime Vendor would be responsible for transportation from their Kenyan distribution point to the customer's location. As stated on page 64 Emergency Air Lifts may be required; if an airlift is needed, the Prime Vendor may be responsible for the air freight as well if the airlift is used to rectify a situation created by lack of planning on the PV's part.

2. Amendment 0005 discusses the availability of FFV in Kenya and that bakery items are to be supported through frozen items and dairy through UHT items. However Kenya is part of zone 2 and there is only one pricing sheet available for zone 2. Does the government expect the PV to source FFV locally in Kenya? If so, how should we price it since we are only allowed one price in the Zone 2 sheet? Will the Government make a separate line item for Kenya?

DLA Troop Support Response: FF&V for Kenya is not currently included in the schedule of items since it is currently being purchased via BPA, therefore, offerors are not required to list FF&V prices for Kenya at this time. However, in the future, the Government may require the PV to provide FF&V to customers in Kenya. At that time, the product price will be established using the new item procedures listed in this solicitation.

3. In regards to the solicitation, will private label holders (i.e. Sysco Labeled items) cost basis be their delivered cost to their dock, or will their cost basis be the manufacturer/grower of that product FOB their dock?

DLA Troop Support Response: See paragraph e. on page 79.

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4. Since it will be necessary to have product on hand that has been purchased since the last price update, and since DSCP has said that without product price approval the price will not be accepted, can we anticipate approval on these requests prior to procurement? Once a product price change has taken place how long will the price approval request take DSCP to respond either up or down?

DLA Troop Support Response: The PV is encouraged to seek product price approvals prior to the items sailing from CONUS. The review process averages about 7 days, but can take longer dependent upon the accuracy of the supporting documentation submitted and the number of fair and reasonable requests received.

5. Historically all U.S. Flagged Sea Transport has been point to point (i.e. designated ocean carrier will provide sea vans and transport them to the CONUS manufacturer or distribution facility. The vans will then be loaded and will then be picked up and transported via DTS to OCONUS port and forwarded on to the Prime Vendor's OCONUS distribution facility by a USTRANSCOM carrier.) Is it point to point?

DLA Troop Support Response: Yes, point to point will be used as explained in paragraph V. TRANSPORTATION of the Statement of Work beginning on page 67.

6. Customs was somewhat ambiguous as to who pays subject to SOFA agreements. Have there been any cases where the Prime Vendor was responsible for customs costs? In what instances is the PV responsible for fees associated with customs?

DLA Troop Support Response: Under DTS Point to Point, it is an ocean carrier responsibility. As stated on page 71 paragraph C. Customs, the Prime Vendor is responsible for customs clearance from his OCONUS facility (s) to the final delivery points.

7. Page 175 states that the distribution price must be the same for both zones. Please clarify in detail, as one zone is more difficult and/or more expensive to service than the other.

DLA Troop Support Response: The language at the bottom of page 175 reads as follows:

Please Note: Distribution prices submitted for all customers in Zone 1 must be the same prices and Distribution prices submitted for all customers in Zone 2 must be the same prices.

This means that the distribution prices must be the same for all customers within each zone, not that distribution prices must be the same for both zones.

8. Refer page 175 of the solicitation – It is stated that distribution price for all customers within a zone should be the same. We feel it will be in the best interest of the Government to have the option of different distribution price for different countries within the zone.

DLA Troop Support Response: It is required that offerors submit proposals with the same distribution prices for all customers within each zone.

9. Please clarify the definition of manufacturer/grower as it pertains to items quoted on the market basket? How are we to treat items, which are quoted from a supplier/distributor (ie Imperial Sales, RPQ, Coastal Pacific, American Bounty, Ocean Direct)?

DLA Troop Support Response: We accept invoices /quotes that meet our criteria as stated in the pricing definitions on page 78.

10. For both Zone 1 and Zone 2, should the UOM for category 86 be pallet spaces as opposed to cases?

DLA Troop Support Response: Cases is the correct UOM for category 86.

11. We are struggling to get all quotes to be within the 45 day validity (i.e. dated after 29 Nov). This has been caused by the latest submittal extension and the fact that communications with manufacturers has been interrupted by the holidays. Therefore my question is will quotes older the 45 days be accepted?

DLA Troop Support Response: The older quotes will be accepted as long as the offeror will hold those prices.

Section III: Revisions (adds/changes/deletions) to the Solicitation

- 1. On page 61 in the third paragraph of paragraph C, change the word "identified" to "listed".
- 2. On page 65 at the bottom after the last paragraph insert the following language:

Commercial airlift costs will not be reimbursed by DLA Troop Support if the airlift is used to rectify a situation created by lack of planning by the PV. Reimbursement for airlift costs will depend on the circumstances requiring the airlift, require sufficient evidence and documentation from the PV, and will be determined at that time. Final approval for payment is at the Contracting Officer's discretion.

3. On the top of page 112 delete paragraph 4 and replace with the following:

4. The T-AFS will respond to any substitution request from the Prime Vendor within 48 hours. The T-AFS will submit all other changes to the original order to the Prime Vendor no later than 6 days prior to required delivery date. The T-AFS will provide a detailed load plan to the Prime Vendor at least 2 days prior to the load-out. The T-AFS will arrange all port contracted facilities and will bear all port costs associated with the load-out (See FOSSAC below). The T-AFS/CTF-53 will provide the capability to load product at the rate of at least 200 pallets per day, and will arrange any Navy required pre-load veterinary inspections. The T-AFS will absorb all customs fees and any demurrage costs associated with offloading delays except when such delays are prime vendor/contractor caused. Demurrage costs will start accruing after 4 hours and these costs shall not exceed \$25 dollars per hour with a maximum of \$400.00 per day per truck. Under extraordinary circumstance the Contractor can provide documentation that the additional costs were unanticipated, unavoidable and have been caused by the Customer. Customers will absorb demurrage costs associated with offloading delays are prime vendor/contractor caused.

The top selected contracts will be based on those submitted for the prime and the major subcontractors, i.e., top contracts may include three (3) from the prime and two (2) from the major subcontractor. Contracts of greater size and complexity will be viewed more favorably, while contracts of smaller size and complexity than that found in this solicitation will be viewed less favorably. When evaluating size and complexity, the total of all contracts submitted will be considered, however, singular contract(s) that most closely resemble the size and complexity of this solicitation will be viewed more favorably.

2. Foreign establishments do not require listing if the pre-packaged, finished product is imported by distributors or brokers into the United States, then exported into the CENTCOM area of responsibility (AOR.) Veterinary inspectors must have documented evidence assuring that products physically entered and departed the United States.

3. Foreign establishments that import meat and poultry product into the Southwest Asia AOR are considered exempt if the establishment is listed in the Foreign Countries and Plants Certified to Export Meat and Poultry to the United States web site: <u>http://www.fsis.usda.gov/regulations & policies/Eligible Foreign Establishments/index.asp</u>.

4. These columns are not intended to be self-limiting or all-inclusive. Refer questions regarding specifically required and specifically exempt items through appropriate Chain of Command to USARCENT/CFLCC Command Veterinarian Office. Food products with a water activity of 0.50 and below are low risk foods and are exempt from listing. 5. Cheese plants producing aged hard cheese do not have to meet pasteurization requirements if the cheese is aged at the manufacturing plant at least 60 days at a temperature of no less than $35^{\circ}F(2^{\circ}C.)$

6. Minimum processing of ready-to-eat fruits and vegetables includes, but is not limited to, the following processes: cleaning, washing, trimming, coring, slicing, and shredding. Other terms used to refer to minimum processed products are "lightly processed," "partially processed," "fresh processed," and "pre-prepared."

7. Unprocessed fresh fruits and vegetables (FF&V) are not considered ready-to-eat. Disinfectant procedures require complete immersion of raw fruits and vegetables of unknown origin in a minimum 200-ppm chlorine solution for 30 seconds or soaking in 160 ° F (72 ° C) potable drinking water for one (1) minute. Treat FF&V from an exempted or approved water source with 100-ppm chlorine for 30 seconds. All consumers are advised to follow applicable service regulations (for Army users, the provisions of TB MED 530 apply.)

8. When listing is required for unprocessed fresh fruits and vegetables (FF&V), listing will be for packing sheds of FF&V, not the actual grower. A packing shed is a facility that performs any of the following before delivery to the U.S. Armed Forces: cleaning, washing, culling, trimming, and packing. Listing is required for distributors of FF&V.

9. Only pasteurized juices are authorized for purchase by the Department of Defense (DOD.)

10. Unless the product is packaged and put through a process to achieve commercial sterility (shelf-stable.)

11. The use of cyclamates in artificially sweetened products is prohibited for beverages sold to U.S. Forces. It is the responsibility of the contracting agencies to ensure that suppliers are aware of this requirement.

12. Establishments furnishing meals purchased with appropriated (APF) or non-appropriated funds (NAF) must meet the requirements of AR 40-657. For one-time occasions, a One-time Risk Assessment/Sanitation Approval is appropriate. Request One-time Risk Assessment/Sanitation Approval through the USARCENT/CFLCC Command Veterinarian Office. If establishment is used continuously, listing is required.
