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SECTION I:

1. Why are offerors not being permitted to revise their proposals, including pricing, in light of the revised evaluation criteria and in light of the passage of time since previous offers were submitted?

DLA Troop Support Response: The Government did not anticipate that revised proposals were necessary because the purpose of the amendment was to clarify the approach for evaluating experience and past performance under Factor II, Experience/Past Performance only.

By execution of the amendment, Offerors agreed to extend the period of acceptance of their previously submitted offers, therefore, no revisions to pricing proposals were deemed necessary.

2. Will the same five contracts be considered in evaluating Subfactor B (Past Performance) as are considered in evaluating Subfactor A (Experience), Element 1 (Size and Complexity)? If not, what other contracts will be evaluated?

DLA Troop Support Response: See amendment 0020, pages 5 and 6. For subfactor A (Experience), element 1 (Size and Complexity), the Government will ONLY consider the offeror's top (five) contracts.

For subfactor B (Past Performance), the Government will consider an offeror's past performance under the offeror's top (five) relevant contracts. However, the Government may also consider government in-house data, such as information on any relevant contracts identified in the Past Performance Information Retrieval System (PPIRS) and Contractor Performance Assessment Reporting System (CPARS), and information received through the Subsistence Total Order and Receipt Electronic System (STORES).

3. Please explain whether the evaluation of Subfactor B (Past Performance) or Subfactor A (Experience), Element 1 (Size and Complexity) will consider contracts on an aggregate basis, on a contract-by-contract basis, or some other basis.

DLA Troop Support Response: See amendment 0020, page 6. Under subfactor A (Experience), element 1 (Size and Complexity), when evaluating size and complexity, the total of all contracts submitted will be considered; however, singular contract(s) that most closely resemble the size and complexity of this solicitation will be viewed more favorably.

Therefore, the Government intends to consider individual contracts to determine whether an individual contract meets 85%-100% of the estimated annual dollar value of \$71M; whether the estimated line items/SKUs are approximately 1200; whether the estimated average delivery stops per week are approximately 17; whether the estimated average line items ordered per week are approximately 120; and whether the estimated average delivery order dollar value is approximately \$80,315, if applicable. If this single contract reference more closely resembles this size and complexity, it will be viewed more favorably.

However, the Government will also consider the <u>total of all contracts submitted</u> by adding together the annual dollar value of all contracts submitted by the offeror.

Under subfactor B (Past Performance), it is not necessary to consider contracts on an aggregate basis because the offeror's performance record is considered under each relevant contract.

4. What is encompassed within the "etc." that appears in the following new language on page 4 of Amendment 0020: "Offerors are advised, however, that the Government intends to request Performance Questionnaires from each contract reference to determine the customer's satisfaction with the offeror's performance regarding supply chain management, warehouse operations, distribution/transportation, data/information management, implementation/transition performance, financial capability, etc."

DLA Troop Support Response: See Performance Questionnaire in Section III below. The Government will evaluate all aspects of contract performance in response to completed Performance Questionnaires. In addition to contract information and an overall performance rating, the elements of the Performance Questionnaire are supply chain management, warehousing operations, distribution/transportation operations, data/information management, transition performance, and financial capabilities. To the extent that the offeror's contract Points of contact provide additional past performance information, such as explanatory comments, this information will also be considered.

5. What is encompassed within the "etc." that appears in the following new language on page 6 of Amendment 0020: "The Government will evaluate the Offeror's experience with contracts of a similar size and complexity (e.g., 85%-100% of the estimated dollar value, number of delivery stops, number of delivery orders, etc.)."

DLA Troop Support Response: See amendment 0020, pages 6 and 7. Under subfactor A (Experience), element 1 (Size and Complexity), the Government will evaluate Offerors against the following estimated size and complexity for the solicited contract:

6. Why is the government only considering fill rate information "for the most recent 12 month period preceding the solicitation issue date" (Amendment 0020 at page 4), rather than more recent fill rate information?

DLA Troop Support Response: The Government will evaluate fill rate under subfactor B (Past Performance.) The Government intends to consider information provided on fill rate information as obtained from revised Performance Questionnaires, and through government inhouse data, such as information received through the Subsistence Total Order and Receipt Electronic System (STORES).

7. Please explain why any "Prime Vendor/Regular Dealer commercial or Government contract involving the delivery of supplies/products to customers on a recurring basis," (Amendment 0020 at 6 and 7) is considered to be a "relevant contract" in light of the size and complexity of the Zone 1 contract.

DLA Troop Support Response: The Agency has the broad discretion to determine what contracts are relevant for evaluation of experience and past performance. Relevant contracts for subfactor A (Experience), element 1 (Size and Complexity) and subfactor B (Past Performance) are Prime Vendor /Regular Dealer commercial or Government contracts involving the delivery of supplies/products to customers on a recurring basis.

8. Please explain to what extent you will, when considering the "total of all contracts submitted" under Factor II, Subfactor A (Experience), Element 1 (Size and Complexity), take into account an offeror's ability to satisfy the requirements of the Zone 1 contract contemporaneously with its ongoing contractual obligations.

DLA Troop Support Response: An offeror's ability to satisfy the requirements of the Zone 1 contract contemporaneously with its ongoing contract obligations is evaluated under Factor I (under subfactor A: Location and Capacity, subfactor B: Resource Availability, and subfactor H: Surge and Sustainment Capability) and is also a question of responsibility. The purpose of subfactor A (Experience), element 1 (Size and Complexity) is to compare the size and complexity of an offeror's relevant contracts (whether they are completed or ongoing) to the solicited requirement. The total of all contracts submitted will be determined as explained in Question 3 above.

9. How is the "integrated assessment" (Amendment 0020 at p. 6) of each subfactor of Factor II different, if at all, from the manner in which the subfactors of Factor I or Factor III are weighed?

DLA Troop Support Response:

The integrated assessment under Factor II, Experience/Past Performance differs from the combined assessment under Factors I and III in that, in addition to combining multiple adjectival ratings based on their relative weights, Factor II involves the combination of experience and past performance information from multiple contracts, received from multiple sources (the offeror's proposal, government in-house data, and responses received from the Performance Questionnaires received from the offeror's Points of contact), which may be received for both the primary offeror and members of a joint venture, partnership, or teaming approach.

SECTION II:

On page 168 of the solicitation, Addendum to FAR 52.212-1 (continued), delete the first sentence of the fourth paragraph under Factor II – Experience/Past Performance and replace it with the following:

Provide a brief performance record of up to five (5) of your highest dollar value or most comparable Prime Vendor / Regular Dealer contracts, for the prime contractor and major subcontractors (the "selected contracts"), whether they are commercial or Government contracts with similar size and complexity (e.g., 85-100% of the estimated annual dollar value, estimated line items/SKUs, estimated average delivery stops per week, estimated average line items ordered per week, and estimated average delivery order dollar value, if applicable).

On page 168 of the solicitation, Addendum to FAR 52.212-1 (continued), delete the second paragraph under Subfactor B (Past Performance) and replace it with the following:

Offerors are advised, however, that the Government intends to request Performance Questionnaires from each contract reference to determine the customer's satisfaction with the offeror's performance regarding supply chain management, warehousing operations, distribution/transportation operations, data/information management, transition performance, and financial capabilities.

On page 186 of the solicitation, Addendum to FAR 52.212-2 (continued), delete the first sentence under Subfactor A (Experience), and replace it with the following:

Element 1 (Size and Complexity) – The Government will evaluate an Offeror's experience with contracts of a similar size and complexity (e.g., 85%-100% of the estimated annual dollar value, estimated line items/SKUs, estimated average delivery stops per week, estimated average line items ordered per week, and estimated average delivery order dollar value, if applicable).

On page 186 of the solicitation, Addendum to FAR 52.212-2 (continued), delete the first paragraph under Subfactor B (Past Performance), and replace it with the following:

The Government will evaluate the Offeror's record of contract performance under the offeror's top (five) relevant contracts with respect fill rate, problems/resolutions, and performance regarding supply chain management, warehousing operations, distribution/transportation operations, data/information management, transition performance, and financial capabilities. This evaluation will be based on information provided with the Offeror's proposal, government in-house data, such as information on any relevant contracts identified in the Past Performance Information Retrieval System (PPIRS) and Contractor Performance Assessment Reporting System (CPARS), and information received through the Subsistence Total Order and Receipt Electronic System (STORES), and responses received from Performance Questionnaires received from the Offeror's Points of contact. To the extent that the offeror's contract Points of contacts provide additional past performance information, such as explanatory comments, this information will also be considered. Relevant contracts for this subfactor are Prime Vendor / Regular Dealer commercial or Government contracts involving the delivery of supplies/products to customers on a recurring basis.
