- a. DLAR 4155.26/AR 40-660/NAVSUPINST 10110.8c/AFI 48-116/MCO 10110.38c, DOD Hazardous Food & Nonprescription Drug Recall System.
- 2. Background: Fuji apples grown by Royal Chinook Orchards tested above the established tolerance level of 5 parts per million (ppm) for Thiabendazole (commonly called TBZ). Thiabendazole is used to control a variety of fruit and vegetable diseases such as mold, blight, rot and stains caused by various fungi. Tolerances or maximum residue limits have been established for agricultural and livestock commodities in 40 CFR§180.242.
- 3. Product Affected: Fuji apples with lot number of **1740** on the cases.

The logo on each case may have only packers information. The possible packers are (this list is **NOT** all inclusive, there may be other packers. The lot number (1740) is on all affected cases):


